

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL HELD IN CITY HALL ON JUNE 27TH, 1907 AT 8:30 A.M.

The Mayor presiding and all the Aldermen present.

Alderman Irwin submitted the Board of Works Report and on motion of Alderman Irwin, seconded by Alderman Dick, the Council resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the following Accounts payment of same having been recommended by the Board of Works, and that the Mayor sign this Resolution and the Clerk affix the Seal thereto:

Workmen fair Wages bill \$806.79

Alderman Emery submitted the Water Works Committee Report and on motion of Alderman Emery, seconded by Alderman Smith, the Council resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the following Accounts, payment of same having been recommended by the Water Works Committee, and that the Mayor sign this Resolution and the Clerk affix the Seal thereto:

Workmen fair Wages Bill \$295.72

Alderman Jordan submitted the School Account and on the Motion of Alderman Jordan, seconded by Alderman Crickmay, the Treasurer was authorized to pay the following Salaries and the Mayor was authorized to sign the Account and the Clerk to affix the Seal thereto:

It was submitted to Alderman Jordan to get a fresh requisition from the School Trustees before striking the Taxes.

Alderman Crickmay submitted the Report of the Fire Committee and on motion of Alderman Crickmay, seconded by Alderman Emery, the Council resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the following Accounts, payment of same having been recommended by Fire Committee, and that the Mayor sign their Resolution, and the Clerk affix the Seal thereto:

It was remitted to the Water Works Committee to get a Fire Hydrant put in at the corner of Twenty-first Street and Lonsdale Avenue.

Letters from the Clerk of the Municipal Council to Reeve May and Mayor Kealy and the Mayor's reply thereto was read, on the question of the adjustment of differences between the City and District on the separation of Interests, particularly in the matter of Office Furniture and Debt. The Mayor explained that this correspondence had arisen from instructions given by him to the City Clerk and City Treasurer, that nothing should be allowed out of the Office, at the present time, excepting those papers and books and plans which pertained solely to the District Municipality, and that the City Clerk had acted on these instructions.

On the motion of alderman Irwin, seconded by Alderman Jordan, the Council sustained the action taken by the Mayor with reference to the correspondence between the Clerk to the Municipal Council, Reeve May, and himself.

After discussion, Alderman Jordan moved, seconded by Alderman Irwin, that if possible a Joint Meeting of the City and District Councils be arranged, to be held at the City Hall on Wednesday next at 9:00 o'clock. This was agreed to and the Clerk was instructed to write to Reeve May to that effect.
