

**MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL HELD WITHIN THE  
CITY HALL ON TUESDAY THE 24<sup>th</sup> DAY OF DECEMBER, 1907 AT  
7:30 O'CLOCK P.M.**

Present:

Mayor Kealy, Alderman Irwin, Alderman Dick and Alderman Smith.

The Bylaw providing for the purchase of the Ferry Service and Lonsdale Gardens was gone over and revised in Committee and thereafter reported to the Council. The said Bylaw received its second reading.

On motion of Alderman Irwin, seconded by Alderman Smith, the Board of Works Committee was instructed to have such repairs as were deemed necessary carried out on that part of Lonsdale Avenue between South Keith Road and 15<sup>th</sup> Street.

The Board of Works Committee reported that certain repairs were deemed necessary to the roadway and culverts on that portion of Keith Road between Mahon Avenue and the Bridge west of Delbruck Avenue. The Committee was empowered to employ the Day Gang, under the supervision of the Engineer, to carry out such repairs as can be conveniently arranged for when the Gang is not otherwise engaged.

Chief of Police Davies reported that a party of Japanese were encamped just above the City water Intake, when he was instructed to give the party notice to remove.
