The Committee's recommendation respecting the advertising for an apprentice to Civil Engineering, being considered at variance with the former recommendation, was referred back for reconsideration.

The remainder of the Committee's report was adopted.

Acting upon the Committee's recommendation that tenders be again called for the clearing and grading of a portion of the Cemetery, the Council decided that tenders be advertised for to be lodged not later than 5 o'clock P.M. on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> inst.

Tenders to state a figure for clearing per acre.

Alderman May suggested that the Council consider the Cemetery proposition jointly with the District Council.

The Report of the Water Works Committee, as contained in the Committee's Minute of 2<sup>nd</sup> July last was read and confirmed.

Mr. A.J. Picton Warlow was present and complained of dangerous blasting being carried on near end of Capilano Car Line.

On enquiry being made it was found that City Workmen were parties responsible, and the road foreman was instructed to engage another powderman.

The second reading of Bylaw No. 12, The Liquor Licence Regulation Bylaw, was completed. The Bylaw was also read a third time and passed by the Council.
