

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD  
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, ON THURSDAY THE 4<sup>th</sup> DAY OF MARCH  
1909 AT 7:00 O'CLOCK P.M.**

The Mayor presiding and all the Aldermen present excepting Alderman McNeish.

Letter - Messrs. Taylor Hume & Innes requesting to be instructed as to whom they should hand over the papers in their possession relating to the various matter which they have in hand for the City. Alderman Young moved that Messrs. Taylor Hume & Innes be directed to hand over all papers and documents to the City Clerk meantime. The motion was seconded by Alderman McRae and agreed to. Alderman Dick dissenting.

Letter - Medical Health Officer, reporting that he thought it would be very desirable for the City to obtain a supply of anti-toxin and dispense it without cost, as required. On motion of Alderman Young and Alderman Braim referred to Public Health Committee to consider and report.

Letter - S.J. Albert, Superintendent, St. Paul's Hospital advising that boy Kirkpatrick could not be transferred to local hospital for one month yet. After discussion Alderman McRae moved that the Medical Health Officer be directed to look into the case and make report. The motion was seconded by Alderman Schultz and agreed to.
