

MINUTES OF MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, ON TUESDAY THE 13th DAY OF APRIL 1909 AT 8:00 O'CLOCK P.M.

His Worship Mayor May presiding and all the Aldermen present.

The Council convened as a Court of Revision on 3rd Street Local Improvement consisting of (a) The clearing, grading, draining, boulevarding and macadamizing of 3rd Street from Mahon to St. David's Avenue and (b) The relaying of the old sidewalk on the North side and the laying of a new 6' sidewalk on the South side of said portion of said Street. The cost of the Improvement was estimated at \$34,828.75 of which \$16,466.46 was to be provided out of the General Funds of the City.

No appeals or complaints having been received from the Owners of Property interested, the Court decided to recommend to the Council that the Improvement be proceeded with, pursuant to the Provisions of the Local Improvement General Bylaw.

On the Council afterwards convening, the Report of the Court of Revision on 3rd Street Local Improvement was received and adopted unanimously.

Alderman Dick moved that the Clerk be instructed to call Tenders for the Work according to the Specifications of the City Engineer.

The motion was seconded by Alderman McNeish and agreed to.

P. Larson waited upon the Council in reference to improving Keith Road from the end of the Car Line through the Park in D.L. 552 to connect with the new Road recently built by the District Council.

Referred to Board of Works Committee with power to act.

Letter - C.H. Cates requesting Permanent Grade for building in Block 124, corner of 4th Street and Mahon Avenue.

Engineer to furnish same in 2 weeks time.

Letter - G.W. Mann - Improvement of Rufus Avenue between 16th and 17th Streets. Referred to Board of Works Committee.

Letter - C.F. Ward, Bandmaster, Vancouver, with reference to proposed Bank Concerts in North Vancouver, during the summer months. To be acknowledged and referred to Publicity Committee.

Report - City Engineer Hanes, recommending that the Pressure Reducing Valve on 19th Street near Moody Avenue be moved to a point South of 19th Street on Lonsdale Avenue, so as to provide a good and sufficient water service to Residents at the upper end of Lonsdale Avenue. On motion of Alderman Dick seconded by Alderman McNeish, authority was granted the Engineer to proceed with the Improvement suggested and to purchase an 8" reducing valve and several lengths of 10" pipe.
