

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, ON TUESDAY THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL
1909 AT 8:00 O'CLOCK P.M.**

His Worship Mayor May presiding and all the Aldermen present excepting Alderman Braim.

Bylaw No. 65 was read, reconsidered, adopted, and finally passed by the Council, and the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to sign the Bylaw, and the Clerk to affix the Corporate Seal thereto.

Bylaw No. 66 was also read, reconsidered, and finally adopted by the Council, and authorized to be signed and sealed as above.

In accordance with instructions received on March 9th, Mr. T.W. Thomasson, City Auditor, submitted a report on the Audit of the City accounts for the year 1908. The report which was a lengthy one and contained several financial statements and general suggestions was read to the meeting after which it was laid on the table pending consideration by the Council, after each Member being furnished with a copy.

Provisions of the Peddlar's Bylaw was afterwards considered, and on motion of Alderman Young seconded by Alderman McRae, Alderman Dick was appointed a Committee to bring in a corrected Bylaw in the form suggested by the Council.

Mayor May reported that the Insurance Policy on the "S.S. North Vancouver" expired on 27th inst. On motion of Alderman McNeish seconded by Alderman McNeish, resolved that the matter of renewal be left in the hands of the Mayor. On motion of Alderman McNeish seconded by Alderman Schultz, the Mayor and Treasurer were authorised to sign and issue a cheque for the amount of the renewal premium.

On motion of Alderman McNeish seconded by Alderman Young, a Committee consisting of the Mayor, Alderman Dick and Alderman McNeish was appointed to wait upon the Indian Chiefs, and ascertain on what terms they would be prepared to dedicate to the City a Street through the Indian Mission, it having been reported to the Council that they were willing to dedicate a Street to the City on their being furnished with free Water and Electric Light.

Alderman Schultz reported that the B.C. Electric Railway Co. had not as yet intimated their willingness to assist towards Band Concerts being held in the City during Summer Months.

On motion of Alderman Dick seconded by Alderman Schultz resolved that this Meeting adjourn until Monday next at 8 p.m.
