## MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON THURSDAY, THE $7^{\rm TH}$ DAY OF OCTOBER, 1909 AT 8 O'CLOCK, P.M.

His Worship Mayor May presiding, Alderman McRae, Alderman Schultz and Alderman Dick.

Bylaw No. 81 being a Bylaw to prevent the discharge of Firearms within the City Limits was introduced, read a first, second and third time and passed by the Council.

Thereafter those members of the City Council present, along with Reeve McNought and District Clerk, Alex Philip, convened in Committee of the Whole and made the following arrangements for the approaching Convention of the Union of B.C. Municipalities.

Mayor May, Reeve McNaught and Ex-Mayor Kealy, were appointed a Committee to arrange for papers for the Convention.

Ex-Mayor Kealy, President Irwin of the Board of Trade and one Member from each Council were appointed a Committee to arrange a Programme of entertainment.

The Committee on Papers was instructed to engage the services of a stenographer for the Convention and the City Clerk was directed to notify Reeve Bose that this was being done.

Resolutions were passed suggesting several amendments to the Municipal Clauses Act, and these were referred to a Committee on resolutions to be drawing up in proper form for submission to the Convention.
