

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON TUESDAY THE 28th DAY OF JUNE,
1910 AT 8 O'CLOCK, P.M.**

His Worship Mayor May presiding and all the Aldermen present.

A letter was read from Reeve J. Y. McNaught of the Burrard Inlet Tunnel & Bridge Co. in which an appeal was made to the Council to vote a liberal amount towards the erection of the Second Narrows Bridge.

The writer expressed his willingness to furnish any information and to discuss the matter more fully with the Council, if desired. On motion of Alderman Schultz seconded by Alderman Irwin it was resolved to invite Reeve McNaught to attend a meeting of the Council to be held next Monday evening at 7:30 to discuss the project with the Council, and that in the meantime the City Solicitor be instructed to prepare the necessary Bylaw or Bylaws to authorize the Council to subscribe for shares in the Company.

Bylaw No. 108 being, a Bylaw to enable the Corporation to borrow \$31,120 for the purpose of acquiring the unsubdivided portions of D.L.'s 547 and 271 for park and other corporation purposes was introduced and read a first and second time.

Bylaw No. 109, being a Bylaw to enable the Corporation to borrow \$26,600 for the purpose of acquiring Block 100, D.L. 550 as a school site was introduced and read a first and second time.

Bylaw No. 110, being a Bylaw to enable the Corporation to borrow \$10,620 for the purpose of acquiring Block 11, D.L. 550 as a School site was introduced and passed a first and second reading.

Bylaw NO. 111, being a Bylaw to enable the corporation to borrow \$12,110 for the purpose of acquiring Block 217, D.L. 546 as a School site was introduced and passed a first and second reading.

Bylaw No. 112, being a Bylaw to authorize the Corporation to sell Lots 9 to 16 inclusive in Block 11, D.L. 273, hitherto held in trust for School purposes was introduced and passed a first and second reading.

Bylaw No. 113, being a Bylaw to enable the Corporation to borrow \$26,000 for the purpose of constructing a drainage sewer on Lonsdale Avenue from 18th street south to the waterfront was introduced and passed a first and second reading.

The Bylaws were referred to the City Solicitor for revision.

Alderman Irwin, Alderman Smith, Alderman McRae and Alderman Schultz were appointed a Committee to interview the N.V. Land and Improvement Co. with

reference to the City obtaining the use of Victoria Park east in which to erect a City Hall and other public buildings.

Council adjourned.
