## MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON THURSDAY THE 14<sup>th</sup> DAY OF JULY, 1910 AT 8 O'CLOCK, P.M.

Bylaw No. 108, The Parks etc. Purchase Loan Bylaw, 1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 109, The School Site Purchase Loan Bylaw No. 2, 1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 110, The School Site Purchase Loan Bylaw No. 3, 1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 111, The School Site Purchase Loan Bylaw No. 4, 1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 112, The School Site Disposal Bylaw,1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 113, The Lonsdale Avenue Drainage Sewer Construction Bylaw, 1910, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

On motion of Alderman McNeish seconded by Alderman Irwin, it was resolved that a vote of the Electors of the City be taken on the above money Bylaws, on Saturday, the 30<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1910, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock, p.m., and that with the City Hall, North Vancouver, B.C. and that City Clerk shepherd be and is hereby appointed Returning Officer to take the vote of such Electors with the usual powers in that behalf.

With reference to the Second Narrows Bridge project, it was decided on the motion of Alderman McNeish and Alderman Irwin to call a public meeting of ratepayers and to meet the provisional Directors of the Tunnel & Bridge Co. to be present and explain the project to the Ratepayers. His Worship the Mayor was empowered to call such Meeting of Ratepayers on such date as will be convenience to the Provisional Directors.

On motion of Alderman Irwin seconded by Alderman Schultz His Worship the Mayor was appointed a Committee of one to take the matter up with the Provisional Directors with a view to ascertaining their wishes in the matter, and to go into the question fully with them with particular reference to plans for the Bridge and location of Railways etc.
