

**MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL AND HELD WITHIN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON THURSDAY THE 28th DAY OF JULY 1910 AT 8
O'CLOCK, P.M.**

His Worship May presiding and all the Aldermen present excepting Alderman McNeish and Alderman Schultz.

There was read to the Meeting, a communication from the City Clerk to the Board of School Trustees in which was set forth the procedure the Board had to pursue in making application to the Council for monies required for extraordinary expenditure.

A letter was also read from the Secretary of the Board of School Trustees submitting the following statement of additional money required by the School Trustees for extraordinary expenditure:

After consideration, Alderman Irwin moved that the estimate be rejected and disapproved by the Council, on the ground of there being no funds on hand for School purposes, with which to meet the proposed expenditure, and that the School Trustees be notified accordingly. The motion was seconded by Alderman Fowler and agreed to.

Alderman Irwin then moved that, in the event of the Mayor received a written request from the School Trustees, to submit a Bylaw for the assent of the Electors, in the manner prescribed by Sec. 68 of the M.C.A., to authorize the proposed expenditure, and the borrowing of \$10,000.00, upon the credit of the Municipality, that this Council approve and authorize the submission of such a Bylaw at the earliest possible date.

The motion was seconded by Alderman McRae and agreed to.
