

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD  
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON TUESDAY THE 30<sup>th</sup> DAY OF AUGUST  
1910 AT 5 O'CLOCK, P.M.**

His Worship Mayor May, presiding and all the Aldermen present.

The majority of the members of the Council had, previous to the meeting, gone over the ground, and inspected the local improvement work proposed on Lonsdale Avenue, between 13<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> streets, and after hearing a report from the Chairman of the Board of Works Committee of the conclusions arrived at, Alderman Irwin moved that the Board of Works Committee and City Engineer be given full power to go ahead with such portion of the work as may be deemed prudent, on the East side of the Avenue.

The motion was seconded by Alderman McRae and agreed to.

Alderman McNeish reported that the Board of Works Committee was of the opinion that the Foreman Building on 1<sup>st</sup> Street could be drained by constructing a drain to the South side of the Street, with an outlet into the Creek at Roger's Avenue.

On motion of Alderman Irwin seconded by Alderman Schultz the Board of Works was empowered to have the work done.

The Board of Works Committee and City Engineer reported their being in favour of grading the Esplanade to permanent grades from Lonsdale Avenue to Roger's Avenue under the Local Improvement plan and of concrete sidewalks being constructed on each side of the Avenue.

The Clerk was directed to invite Mr. J.A. McMullan, Mr. P. Larson, Mr. J. Bulfour Ker and a representative from the North Vancouver Land & Improvement Co., property owners interested, to attend a meeting of the Council, to be held next Tuesday evening, to discuss the advisability of proceeding with this work.

On motion of Alderman Schultz seconded by Alderman Fowler, the Board of Works Committee was instructed to act in the matter of abating a nuisance being created at Upper Keith Road and Lonsdale Avenue.

On motion of Alderman McNeish seconded by Alderman McRae, permission was granted Messrs. Hope and Barker, Architects, to construct a septic tank under the sidewalk, to connect with the new Masonic Temple, the tank to be constructed under the supervision of the City Engineer and to be removed when sewer is installed on Lonsdale Avenue.

Council thereafter adjourned.
