

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL, HELD WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON MONDAY THE 24<sup>th</sup> DAY OF OCTOBER 1910 AT 8 O'CLOCK, P.M.**

His Worship Mayor May presiding, and all the Aldermen present.

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of 17<sup>th</sup> and of the Adjourned Regular Meeting of 19<sup>th</sup> inst. were read and on motion adopted.

Communications were received and disposed of as follows:

From City Engineer respectfully requesting that office accommodation connected with his Department be enlarged, and referring Council to plan of proposed additions prepared by Architect Wickinden in 1907.

On motion of Alderman McNeish and Alderman McRae referred to Board of Works Committee and Alderman Smith.

From John G. Farmer, C.M.C. intimating that District Council is prepared to bear one half the cost (not exceeding \$250) of repairing the Lillooet Trail if City undertake the work and provide a grade not exceeding 12 percent.

From City Engineer reporting that the grade of the Lillooet Trail is from 14.3 of an average to about 15% in steepest places and that the proposed new road has a rise of 50 feet in 100 feet or 50%.

From City Engineer reporting visit made by Board of Works Committee to Cemetery, that upon examination it was found that the most suitable ground in addition to that being used at present consisted of about 2.9 acres just above the present cleared portion and about three or four acres on opposite side of Lillooet Trail. The rest of the ground consisted of quite steep side hills, ravines, and ridges and would entail the expenditure of large sums of money to make it suitable for Cemetery purposes. Alderman Fowler was of opinion that steps should be taken to acquire another site. Alderman Irwin moved that report be received and remit made to Committee continued. The motion was seconded by Alderman Schultz and agreed to.

From D. Spencer, Superintendent of Temperance and Moral Reform requesting Council to pass upon desired amendments to Municipal Clauses Act respecting Liquor License, appointment of Licensing and Police Commissioners, White Slave Traffic, Licentiousness and Moving Picture shows.

On motion of Alderman Schultz seconded by Alderman Smith referred to Ratepayers Committee to deal with.

Mr. J. Balfour Ker in reply to an enquiry was informed that no change had been made in the grade of the Esplanade since March.

Mr. W. Hogg requested temporary sidewalk to give communication with store on north side of Esplanade.

Referred to Engineer and Board of Works to do utmost to relieve situation.

A tender received from Wm. Germyn offering to supply forty cords good sound fir cordwood at \$4.25 per cord, was, on motion of Alderman Smith and Alderman McNeish accepted by the Council.

In connection with the tenders called for vitrified sewer pipe, Messrs. C.F. Jackson & Co., advised that their principals could not possibly receive specifications until today or tomorrow and asked to have time extended.

The City Engineer suggested that time be extended and tenders received one week hence.

On motion of Alderman Irwin seconded by Alderman McRae, resolved that time be extended till 1<sup>st</sup> November at 5 p.m.

A Plan of subdivision of portion of Lot 2, Block 229, D.L. 545, was on motion of Alderman Fowler and Alderman Irwin approved by Council.

Reports and recommendations by the Finance (General), Board of Works (General and Local Improvement) and Water Works Committees on due accounts were submitted and read to the meeting and the Treasurer was authorized to pay accounts to the amounts following, viz:

The report of the Finance Committee as contained in the Committee's Minutes of this date was read to and adopted by the Council.

The report of the Board of Works Committee as contained in the Committee's Minutes of this date was also read to and on motion of Alderman Irwin and Alderman McNeish adopted the Council.

The Fire & Light Committee recommended that a Street arc light be placed at the corner of 19<sup>th</sup> Street and Mahon Avenue. On motion of Alderman McNeish and Alderman Irwin the Committee's recommendation was accepted by the Council.

Alderman McNeish submitted and read Auditor's Report and Financial Statements for period for 30<sup>th</sup> June to 30<sup>th</sup> September which were on motion of Alderman Fowler and am ordered to be filed.

Bylaw No. 134 - The Boxing Regulation Bylaw, was read, reconsidered, adopted and finally passed by the Council and the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to sign the Bylaw and the Clerk to affix the Corporate Seal thereto.

An abstract and Report of Search of Titles to all lanes in D.L. 274 having been received from the City Solicitor, and a Memo of all lanes owned by Mr. Hammersley having been prepared therefrom by the Clerk, Alderman Irwin moved that the city Engineer be requested to report on the opening up of all lanes owned by Mr. Hammersley, under the provisions of Section 256 of the Municipal Clauses Act.  
The motion was seconded by Alderman McNeish and agreed to.

The Engineer was asked to report on a suitable location for storage reservoir.

The specifications for sewer pipe were read to and approved by the Council.
