MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL, HELD WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON THURSDAY THE 6th DAY OF APRIL 1911 AT 8 O'CLOCK P.M.

Present: His Worship Mayor McNeish presiding, Alderman Henderson,

Alderman Smith, Alderman Dick, and Alderman Biss.

Acting Reeve Allan and District Councillor Bridgeman addressed the Council relative to the District being reimbursed for damages caused to Lynn Valley Road by leaks in City water main.

On the suggestion of Alderman Dick the Board of Works Committee and the City Engineer were asked to consider the advisability of providing a better means of access to Lynn Valley from the City, and for that purpose to consider the cost of constructing a suitable roadway to the Valley keeping in view them most feasible route and best grade and report to the Council at next meeting.

Councillor Bridgeman reported that the District Council was prepared to waive all claim to the dam site if the City would undertake to protect the District Council against all claims which may be made by property owners from whom the land was taken for road purposes and merely grant the District a sufficient road allowance through the property.

On motion of Alderman Dick seconded by Alderman Smith resolved that City Council agree to this and that City and District Solicitors be instructed to draw up an agreement embodying these conditions.

N. Cronin was heard on behalf of petition sent in by City employees for increase in wages.

A petition received from the Carpenters Union asking Council to see that none but union men are employed on public works was filed.

The City Clerk was instructed to forward copy plans and descriptions of proposed extension of the Esplanade along the foreshore of the Squamish Mission Indian Reserve to Mr. Stanton of the Department of Marine and Fisheries and to Mr. Pedley, Deputy Superintendent - General of Indian Affairs, Ottawa, also to Mr. Keefer, New Westminster, Mr. Gordon, Victoria and the Harbor Master, Vancouver and to inform them that the plan was being sent at the request of the Department of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa, for them to report upon.

On motion of Alderman Henderson seconded by Alderman Dick, resolved that the District Council be communicated with and asked to appoint a Committee to meet the City Council and discuss extensions to the City boundaries.

On motion of Alderman Henderson seconded by Alderman Dick resolved that the Engineer have full power to consult with the City Solicitor regarding local improvement assessment.
