

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD  
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON WEDNESDAY THE 20<sup>th</sup> DAY OF  
SEPTEMBER 1911 AT 8 O'CLOCK P.M.**

Bylaw No. 180, the Waterworks Loan Bylaw No. 2, 1911, was read a third time. The Engineer reported that \$30,000 was made up in the following manner:

Laying 8" pipe on Esplanade, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Streets - \$11,750.  
Laying 8" main on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to connect with Esplanade, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Streets  
- \$5,800;  
Amount to meet general expenditures for the balance of the year -  
\$12,450;  
Total - \$30,000.

That if a Bylaw is passed for this amount it will be necessary to use \$12,450 for general purposes including the connecting of existing houses to the cast iron water pipe which will be laid on Esplanade, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Streets. On motion of Alderman Biss seconded by Alderman Smith resolved that Bylaw be passed by the Council on understanding that money is expended according to Engineer's statement.

Bylaw No. 181, the Fire Brigade assistance Bylaw 1911, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 182, the Schools Extraordinary expenditure loan Bylaw 1911, was also read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 183, the 15<sup>th</sup> Street property purchase loan Bylaw was read a third time. Alderman Dick again inquired what corporate purposes property was to be used for.

The Mayor stated that property might be used for pound site, Board of Works and Waterworks departmental store and yards, Hospital, sub-police station. That if the property was subdivided it would be necessary for the City to expropriate two lots fronting on Lonsdale Avenue to allow of 16<sup>th</sup> Street being carried through at a cost of \$10,000.

Alderman Henderson moved that the Bylaw be passed by the Council. The motion was seconded by Alderman Smith and agreed to. Alderman Dick voting nay.

Bylaw No. 184, the Streets maintenance loan Bylaw, 1911, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Bylaw No. 185, the Health loan Bylaw, was read a third time and passed by the Council.

On motion of Alderman Henderson seconded by Alderman Smith resolved that the vote of the Electors of the City be taken on the above Bylaws on Saturday the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October and that City Clerk Shepherd be appointed Returning Officer to take such vote with usual powers in that behalf.

Progress estimates certified correct by the City Engineer were passed for payment as follows:
