

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON THURSDAY THE 26th DAY OF
OCTOBER 1911 AT 8 O'CLOCK P.M.**

The Engineer submitted a tabular statement of the Tenders received for the construction of sewers on the Esplanade and Second Street. He recommended that the tender of Kennedy Bros. for the construction of a sanitary sewer with lot connections on the Esplanade and Crescent Street from St. George's Avenue to St. David's Avenue, at the price of \$22,250 be accepted.

On motion of Alderman Dick seconded by Alderman Kittson resolved that Engineer's recommendation be accepted and contract awarded accordingly.

With reference to the tenders for sewer on Second Street the Engineer reported that the tender of K.R. Paykull at \$10,121 was not accompanied with a marked cheque in accordance with the call for tenders and he recommended that the tender of Messrs. Ledingham & Cooper for the construction of a sanitary sewer with lot connections on Second Street from 300 feet east of St. Andrew's Avenue to St. David's Avenue at the price of \$10,504.80 be accepted.

On motion of Alderman Smith seconded by Alderman Biss resolved that Engineer's recommendation be accepted and contract awarded accordingly.

Alderman McRae submitted report of Finance Committee recommending that school accounts to the amount of \$1435 be paid.

On motion Committee's recommendation was accepted and accounts passed for payment.

Monday next being Thanksgiving Day and Public holiday Council decided on motion of Alderman Smith and Alderman Kittson to hold next Regular Meeting on Tuesday the 31st inst. at 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Mr. W.L. Keene addressed the Council with reference to application made by Horticultural Society for rebate of taxes on Horticultural grounds. It was pointed out to Mr. Keene that Council had no statutory power to grant rebate of taxes only to grant aid to Horticultural Societies.

Mr. Keene decided to have the application amended for a grant of money in aid of the Society.
