

**MINUTES OF REGULAR ADJOURNED MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON AUGUST 1ST, 1912.**

Bylaw No. 213, being a Bylaw to further amend the Local Improvement General Bylaw, was read a first, second and third time and passed by the Council.

It was moved by Alderman Dick seconded by Alderman Biss that the Mayor and Alderman Irwin be appointed a Committee for the reception of the Governor General of Canada and the Duchess of Connaught on their visit to the City on the 20th September. The Committee to have power to add to its number if necessary.

The Clerk intimated that as instructed he had written to Messrs. Tolosov & Varr to attend before the Council meeting, but neither of them were present. Clerk was accordingly instructed to write Messrs. Tolosov & Varr asking them to attend the meeting on Monday night and that if they failed to do so the matter would be placed in the hands of the City Solicitor.

In connection with the lighting of Lonsdale Avenue Mr. F.C. Deguerre appeared before the Council and gave a description of a new system of lighting which he desired the Council to adopt. The matter was referred to the Fire & Light Committee and Mr. Deguerre was asked to go into the matter more fully with the Committee.

The Mayor produced a letter from the Bank of B.N.A. stating the City's account had been credited with the sum of \$586,139.16 being the proceeds of Debentures forwarded to their London office. The letter also stated that the City's account had been charged with \$192.00 being 1/32 of 1%.
