

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD
WITHIN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER ON MONDAY, JUNE 30th, 1913 AT
8 O'CLOCK P.M.**

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the 23rd June were read and on motion adopted.

Correspondence was received, read and dealt with as follows:

From His Worship the Mayor stating that the share which he held in the Ferry Company as purchase by him from Ex Mayor McNeish who received the same from Ex Mayor May. Ex Mayor May received his share by transfer from C.S. Arnold who is one of the original subscribers to the Memorandum of Articles of Association. Filed.

From Alex Phillip stating that his client Harry Randell wishes a ten year lease of the St. Andrew's Avenue street end and asking if the same can be granted, and if so at what rental. Referred to Committee of the Whole.

From J.W. Wilkinson, Secretary, Vancouver Trades and Labor Council, suggesting that the Provincial Government be requested to purchase all unsaleable civic and Municipal Bonds of Vancouver City and surrounding Municipalities. Referred to Finance Committee.

From the Clerk of the Police Commissioners stating that in the opinion of the Commissioners the time is now opportune for the purchase by the City of a site for a Police Station and Court House. Referred to Committee of the Whole.

From A.G. Perry, Local Manager, B.C. Electric Railway Co. stating that street arc lights were installed and in operation at Larson Road and 24th Street and Larson Road and 27th Street on June 25th. Referred to Fire & Light Committee.

From W.H. Robinson offering for sale one team of horses, rig and harness which are already in the employment of the City. Referred to Board of Works and Waterworks Committees.

From A.F. Muston, regarding a culvert across the gully on 22nd Street West and also as to sidewalk on the same street. Referred to Board of Works.

From H.C. Wright asking for a wagon road on Rufus Street from 14th to 15th Streets. Referred to Board of Works.

From the City Engineer recommending that a V-shaped gutter be placed on the north side of 15th Street. Referred to City Solicitor for his opinion as to whether it is competent to use the surplus let over from grading of 15th Street for the above work.

from S.A. Lawrence and others making application for grading road on the northerly portion of 25th Street between Mahon and Chesterfield Avenues. Referred to Board of Works.

From A.L. Vezina et al asking for a sidewalk on 25th Street from Chesterfield to Mahon Avenues. Referred to Board of Works.

From A.E. Newman et al asking for a sidewalk on 27th Street between Chesterfield and Mahon. Avenues. Referred to Board of Works Committee.

From W.J. Baird asking for as statement showing the amounts that had been paid on the site recently occupied by the City Hall with the dates of payment and also statement showing the rate and amount of interest asked for by the City. Referred to Finance Committee.

From Alex. K. Evans enclosing draft for \$33.70 in payment of Fireman McMillan's injury received on 12th April. Referred to Fire & Light Committee.

From the Deputy Attorney General requesting payment of \$2,231 being the amount of fines retained by the City before the appointment of a Police Magistrate and cost of the maintenance of City Prisoners in the Provincial Jail. Referred to Finance Committee.

From W.B. Lees asking for a reduction in his water rate for his apartment house on southwest corner of 8th and Chesterfield Avenue. Referred to Water Committee.

Moved by Alderman Vance seconded by Alderman Kennedy and resolved that the City Engineer be instructed to place a notice on the gravel pit on Fell Avenue prohibiting any person from taking any gravel or sand therefrom.

Moved by Alderman Kennedy seconded by Alderman Vance and resolved that the City Engineer be instructed to find out the person or Company responsible for putting sand in the roadway on Fell Avenue and to make arrangements to have it moved.

Reports and recommendations by the Finance, Police, Board of Health, School, Board of Works, Local Improvement, Water, Fire and Light and Parks

Committees on due accounts were submitted by the respective Chairmen and read to the meeting and the Treasurer was authorized to pay the accounts to the amounts following:

Bylaw No. 257, being a "The Consolidated Local Improvement Bylaw, 1913", was read a first, second and third time and passed by the Council.
