

CERTIFICATE OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Municipal Election Held on January 15, 1914

I, John Frederick Collins, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute I gave Notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver on the second day of January, 1914, as required by law, to the effect that nominations for the Election of persons to represent the said Electors in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen and the Election to two persons to represent them as School Trustees, for two years, would be received by me at any time between the date of the Notice and 2 o'clock p.m., Monday, January 12th, 1914, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, more Candidates stood nominated than there were vacancies to be filled. A poll became necessary and such Poll was granted by me and opened at No. 80 Lonsdale Avenue on Thursday, January 15th, 1914 between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m., and that after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted, resulting as follows:

and I forthwith declared William John Irwin, duly elected as Mayor, and: Richmond C. Biss, Robert J. Fowler, Thomas Leslie Kennedy, Alexander Philip, George Washington Vance and Henry C. Wright duly elected as Aldermen, and

Marcus Servius McDowell and Edwy Allan Morden elected as School Trustees for two years.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1913, I caused certified copies of Bylaws entitled, "The North Vancouver City Ferries Purchase Bylaw,"; "The North Vancouver City Ferries Purchase Loan Bylaw" and "The Industries Bonus Opinion Bylaw", to be published and posted as required by law together with Notices appended thereto, that the said Bylaws would be submitted for a vote of the assent of the Electors at No. 80 Lonsdale Avenue on Thursday, January 14th, 1914, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m., and that the aforesaid vote of the Electors was taken on the said day, resulting as follows:

The vote polled in favor of the three several Bylaws aforementioned being at least three-fifths of the persons who voted on said Bylaws.
