

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD WITHIN THE  
COUNCIL CHAMBER, THURSDAY, DECEMBER 23<sup>rd</sup> 1915 AT 9:00 P.M.**

Pursuant to adjournment the Mayor called the Council to order.

Moved by Alderman MacDonald seconded by Alderman Kennedy and resolved that a ballot be taken on the applications submitted for the position of Advertising Manager on the City Ferries. Whereupon the ballot was spread resulting as follows: Ernest Wilmot 5. None other of the applicants received a vote.

Moved by Alderman MacDonald seconded by Alderman Kennedy and resolved that Mr. E. Wilmot be and is hereby appointed Advertising Manager for the City Ferries, and that an Agreement be entered into in respect to the amount of commission or otherwise to be paid Mr. Wilmot.

The question of submitting a plebiscite to the Electors in respect to operating the city ferries was discussed at length at the conclusion of which it was moved by Alderman Wright seconded by Alderman Biss and resolved that this matter be laid over until Monday, December 27<sup>th</sup>.

A letter was read from City Solicitor Sutton advising the Council that it was not competent for them to guarantee Debentures of any manufactory or industry about to be established in the City of North Vancouver that would compete with one of a like nature already established. Moved by Alderman Wright seconded by Alderman Kennedy and resolved that the City Solicitor be asked to submit an opinion as to whether it would be competent for the City to guarantee debentures on the construction of a graving dock to be established in the City of North Vancouver.

Moved by Alderman Kennedy seconded by Alderman Wright and resolved that the proposed amendments to the Waterworks Bylaw be laid over until Monday, December 27<sup>th</sup>.

At 10:25 it was moved by Alderman Wright seconded by Alderman Vance and resolved that the Council adjourn.
