

## CERTIFICATE OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Municipal Election held on

January 13th, 1916

I, John Frederick Collins, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute I gave notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 1915, as required by law, to the effect that nominations for the Election of persons to represent the said Electors in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen and the Election of two persons to represent them as School Trustees, for two years, and the election of one person to represent them as Police Commissioner for one year (being the unexpired term of James W. Hay resigned) would be received by me at any time between the date of the Notice and 2 o'clock p.m., Monday, January 10<sup>th</sup>, 1916, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, more Candidates stood nominated than there were vacancies to be filled in the case of Mayor, Aldermen and School Trustees for two years, a poll became necessary and such Poll was granted by me and opened at No. 78 Lonsdale Avenue on Thursday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, 1916 between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m., and that after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted, resulting as follows:

And that I forthwith declared George Samuel Hanes duly elected as Mayor, and Christopher F. Foreman, William Jack Barclay, Edwy Allan Morden, Richmond C. Biss, Henry Clark Wright and Thomas Irwin duly elected as Aldermen, and Egerton Ryerson Follick and Marcus S. McDowell duly elected as School Trustees for two years.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1915, I caused certified copies of Bylaws entitled, "The North Shore Iron Works, limited Exemption Bylaw, 1915" and "The Wallace Shipyards Limited Exemption Bylaw 1915", to be published and posted as required by law together with notices appended thereto, that the said Bylaws would be submitted for a vote of the assent of the Electors at No. 78 Lonsdale Avenue on Thursday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, 1916 between the hours of 9 o'clock A.M. and 7 o'clock P.M., and that the said vote of the Electors was taken on the said day resulting as follows:

"The North Shore Iron Works Exemption Bylaw 1915"

The vote polled in favor of the "two above mentioned Bylaws being at least three-fifths of the persons who voted on said Bylaws I declared the said two Bylaws as having duly received the assent of the Electors.

CERTIFICATE OF RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Election held for School Trustee  
for One Year on January 10, 1916

I, JOHN FREDERICK COLLINS, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute I gave notice to the Electors of the City of

North Vancouver on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 1915 as required by law to the effect that nominations for the election of a person to represent the said Electros as School Trustee for one year (to fill the unexpired term of James W. Hay resigned) would be received by me at any time between the date of the notice and two o'clock P.M. Monday, January 10<sup>th</sup>, 1916, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, the only nomination received for said vacancy was Albert George Perry, and there being no more nominations received than there were vacancies to fill, I forthwith declared Albert George Perry duly elected to serve as School Trustee for one year, being the unexpired term of James W. hay resigned.
