

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL HELD WITHIN  
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, TUESDAY, APRIL 18<sup>th</sup>, 1916 AT 8:00 P.M.**

Pursuant to adjournment the Mayor called the Meeting to order.  
The regular order of business was dispensed with and reconsideration of Bylaws proceeded with.

Moved by Alderman Foreman seconded by Alderman Wright and resolve that the Bylaw entitled "A Bylaw to Repeal the City of North Vancouver Temporary Loan Bylaw 1916, No. 345" be now reconsidered, finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. Whereupon the Bylaw was reconsidered, finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.

Moved by Alderman Wright seconded by Alderman Foreman and resolved that the Bylaw entitled, "A Bylaw to authorize the borrowing of certain moneys from the Royal Bank of Canada to meet the current lawful expenditure of the Corporation of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1916" be now reconsidered, finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. Whereupon the Bylaw was reconsidered, finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and Clerk and sealed with the corporate seal.

Moved by Mayor Hanes seconded by Alderman Foreman and resolved that the Military authorities at Ottawa be communicated with and requested to allow the various troops recruiting in Vancouver and vicinity to remain at the point of recruiting instead of sent to the interior of the Province.

Mr. Blackburn was present and on motion addressed the Council.

He stated that cattle and horses were still bothering the residents in the neighborhood of 19<sup>th</sup> Street and Chesterfield Avenue and stated that Mr. Walters one of the owners of the cows, was becoming abusive; he also stated that he was hauling fresh manure from the stable and spreading it on vacant lots.

Moved by Alderman Wright seconded by Alderman Foreman and resolved that the Chief of Police be informed that cattle and horses are bothering the residents in the vicinity of 19<sup>th</sup> street and Chesterfield Avenue and that he be instructed to stop the owners of cattle from permitting them to roam at large or be a nuisance to the residents in teat district, and also to investigate in respect to the alleged nuisance of spreading fresh manure on vacant lots and to put a stop to the same if he finds it a nuisance.

At 8:40 it was moved by Alderman Foreman seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the Council adjourn.
