

MINUTES OF ADJOURNED COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, JULY 13TH, 1916 T 7:30 P.M.

The City Solicitor, A.C. Sutton, submitted a draft Agreement re lease of Chesterfield Avenue street end to the Pacific Great Eastern Railway Co. The Agreement was read, then taken up and considered clause-by-clause and amended. Moved by Alderman Barclay and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the proposed Agreement re Chesterfield Avenue street end be referred back to techs to redraw according to the amendments made.

A letter was received from the Department of Marine & Fisheries asking if the City had any objections to the granting of a Quit Claim Deed to a Water Lot on Burarrd Inlet in front of Port Moody. Moved by Alderman Wright and seconded by Alderman Barclay and resolved that the Department of Marine & Fisheries be advised that as far as the City of North Vancouver is concerned there is no objections to a Quit Claim being issued to Boyds Limited for a certain water lot in front of Port Moody.

Mrs. J. Rogers on behalf of the French Red Cross Society asked that permission be given for holding a tag day in North Vancouver on August 4th, 1916. Moved by Alderman Irwin and seconded by Alderman Barclay and resolved that permission be granted to hold a tag day in aid of the French Red Cross Society, provided satisfactory arrangements could be made between the French Red Cross Society and the local branch of the Canaian Red Cross.

Mr. Robert Chance was present and on motion was granted permission to address the Council. Whereupon he advised that he was reorganizing the old City Band and requested that they be given permission to use the Old Ferry Board Room. Moved by Alderman Wright and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that permission be and is hereby given to Mr. Robert Chance on behalf of the North Vancouver city Band to use the old ferry Board Room for the purpose of practicing and storing their instruments during the pleasure of the Council. Mr. Chance advised the Council that a man by the name of O'Neill had a baritone instrument, the property of the band, which he refused to give up. Moved by Alderman Wright and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the City Solicitor write to Mr. O'Neill demanding return of the instrument to the North Vancouver City Band.

At 8:45 it was moved by Alderman Barclay and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the Council adjourn, whereupon the Council adjourned.
