

MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE COUNCIL HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, THURSDAY, JUNE 14TH, 1917 AT 8:30 P.M.

Moved by Alderman Barclay and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the tender of W.D. McFarland & Company, through the Guardian Casualty & Guarantee Company for public liability on the ferries, at the price of 35 cents per \$100.00 of gross traffic receipts, be and is hereby accepted, subject to the approval of the City Solicitor.

A letter was read from George E. Kyle, City Collector, recommending the appointment of Robert I. Docherty for the position of assistant in the Collector's Office and stating that but one application from a returned Soldier had been received and that he did not consider him to have the qualifications for the position.

Moved by Alderman Barclay seconded by Alderman Wright that the Returned Soldiers' association of the North Shore be notified that there is a position vacant in the Collector's Office and that the council is open for applications from Returned Soldiers resident on the North Shore and not at present time employed, applications to be in the hands of the City Clerk, not later than 5 P.M. June 18th, 1917.

The following amendment was offered:

Moved by Alderman Clark and seconded by Alderman McBain that the recommendation of Mr. George E. Kyle, City Collector be approved.

Upon the vote being taken the Amendment was declared lost. Whereupon the motion was put and the original resolution was declared carried.

Moved by Alderman Barclay and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the tenders for painting the City Hall be opened. Whereupon the tenders were opened and only one tender was received, namely from Mr. Thomas E. Sedgwick & George W. Harding, at the price of \$750.00.

Moved by Alderman Irwin and seconded by Alderman Wright and resolved that the above tender for painting the City Hall be referred to the Engineer for report and an estimate for doing the work by day labour.

Moved by Alderman Irwin and seconded by Alderman Clark and resolved that His Worship Mayor Vance and Alderman Barclay be a Committee to act in conjunction with a similar Committee from the District of North Vancouver to devise a basis whereby the District can assist the City in meeting the deficit in the operation of the ferries.

Moved by Alderman Clark and seconded by Alderman Barclay and resolved that a telegram be sent immediately to the Government at Victoria requesting the Government to offer its services as arbitrator in the dispute between the B.C. Electric Railway Co. and the employees with a view to speedy settlement.

At 9:35 it was moved by Alderman Morden and seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the Council adjourn. Whereupon the Council adjourned.
