

MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF COUNCIL, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, THURSDAY, DECEMBER 5th, 1918, AT 9:00 P.M.

Tenders were received from the North Shore Press and from Shoemaker and McLean, for printing assessment notices.

Moved by Alderman Watson seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the tender of the North Shore Press for supplying 6,000 assessment cards and 400 sheets at the price of \$18.75 be accepted, their tender being the lowest.

Moved by Alderman Watson seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that a letter be forwarded to the B.C. Electric Railway Co. with respect to the over-crowding of all cards, but more especially those on Lonsdale Avenue, between the hours of 5 and 7 p.m. on each week day, and all of the afternoon and evening after 12 o'clock noon on Saturdays.

Mr. C. Talbot Haslam, tendered his resignation as City Assessor for the City of North Vancouver which position was held by him at the time of his enlistment for overseas service, in order to avoid any confusion or question of the legality of the Assessment. Moved by Alderman Watson seconded by Alderman Morden and resolved that the resignation of Mr. C. Talbot Haslam as City Assessor, held by him at the time of his enlistment for overseas service, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Moved by Alderman Irwin seconded by Alderman Morden and resolved that Mr. Lane secure the temporary services of Mr. C. Talbot Haslam for sending out assessment notices by adding at a rate per day on the basis of \$125.00 per month.

Moved by Alderman Watson seconded by Alderman McBain and resolved that the Council adjourn. Whereupon the Council adjourned.
