

CERTIFICATE OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Municipal Election held on

January 13th and 16th, 1919

I, Rupert Foster Archibald, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute I gave notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver on the 3rd day of January, 1919, as required by law, to the effect that nominations for the Election of persons to represent the said Electors in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen and the Election of three (3) persons to represent them as School Trustees, for two years, and the election of two (2) persons to represent them as Police Commissioners, one for two year; and one for one year to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. C.E. Johnston, would be received by me at any time between the date of the Notice and 2 o'clock p.m., Monday, January 13th, 1919, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, no more Candidates stood nominated for the office of School Trustees, than there were vacancies to be filled.

I forthwith declared Archie Leroy Clements, Albert George Perry and Albert Richard Steacy, duly elected as School Trustees for Two (2) years.

There being more nominations of Candidates as aforesaid in the case of Mayor, Aldermen and Police Commissioners for one year, also Police Commissioners for Two years, than there were vacancies to be filled, a Poll became necessary, and such Poll was granted by me and opened at 113 First Street, East, on Thursday, January 16th, 1919, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m., and that after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted, resulting as follows:

AND that I forthwith declared George George Washington Vance, duly elected as Mayor.

AND Bruce Watson; Benjamin Ernest Townsley; William John Irwin; Edwy Allan Morden; Thomas Irwin and Benjamin Evans, duly elected as Aldermen.

AND George Dymond Hoyland duly elected as Police Commissioner for one year to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Charles E. Johnston.

AND Michael Brown Martinson duly elected Police Commissioner for two years.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1918, I caused certified copies of a Bylaw entitled "City of North Vancouver Power Company Ratification Bylaw, 1918" to be published and posted as required by law, together with notices appended thereto, that the said Bylaw would be submitted for a vote of the assent of the Ratepayers at No. 113, First Street East, on Thursday January 16th, 1919, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m. and that the said vote of the Electors was taken on the said day, resulting as follows:

For the Bylaw	483
Against the Bylaw	90
Spoiled Unmarked ballots	110

The vote polled in favor of the above mentioned Bylaw being at least three-fifths of the persons who voted on said Bylaw, I declared the said Bylaw as having duly received the assent of the Electors.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1918, I caused a notice to be published and posted to the effect that the opinion of the Electors of said City would be taken upon the question:

"Are you in favor of the City purchasing from Pete Larsen, Lots 1 to 17 inclusive, Block 178, DL 271, City of North Vancouver, extending from the Esplanade southerly to Burrard Inlet, and from Chesterfield Avenue easterly approximately 425 feet, including the water lot, for a price of \$85,000.00 for Industrial or Municipal purposes, to be paid for by an issue of City Debentures running 20 years bearing 6 percent interest?"

The vote resulted as follows:
