

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 18TH, 1919, AT 8:00 P.M.

The Clerk stated that a letter had been received by Mr. Edmond, from E. Read, Secretary National Association Marine engineers, asking for a final decision with respect to the application for an increase in pay for the Ferry Engineers, and stating that failing a satisfactory conclusion, on or before Thursday noon, he tenders the customary 24 hours notice.

On receipt of the above communication the Mayor had issued instructions to call a special meeting of Council in order that the matter might be dealt with expeditiously.

The letter was then read to the Meeting and referred to the Committee of the Whole Council to be dealt with at once.

A letter was also received from Alderman Thomas Irwin, regretting his inability to be present and requesting that the Council be informed that he sees no reason to change his opinion from the decision which the Council had already arrived at and of which Mr. Read had been informed. Ordered filed.
