

CERTIFICATE OF RETURNING OFFICER

Report of Municipal Election held on January 15th, 1920

I, RUPERT FOSTER ARCHIBALD, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute, I gave notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver on the 2nd day of January 1920, as required by law, to the effect that nominations for the Election of persons to represent the said Electors, in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen, and the Election of two(2) persons to represent them as School Trustees, for two years, and the election of one (1) person to represent them as Police Commissioner for two (2) years, would be received by me at any time between the date of the Notice and 2 o'clock p.m., Monday, January 12th, 1920, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, no more Candidates stood nominated for the office of Mayor, than there were vacancies to be filled.

I forthwith declared GEORGE WASHINGTON VANCE duly elected as Mayor for the City of North Vancouver for the ensuing year.

There being more nominations of Candidates as aforesaid in the case of Aldermen , School Trustees and Police Commissioner, than there were vacancies to be filled, a Poll became necessary and such Poll was granted by me and opened at 113 First Street East, on Thursday, January 15th, 1920, between the hours of 9:00 o'clock a.m. and 7:00 o'clock p.m. and that after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted, resulting as follows:

AND that I forthwith declared William John Irwin; Dugald Henderson McColl; Bruce Watson; Benjamin Ernest Townsley; James Hudson Pilling; and Thomas Irwin duly elected as Aldermen.

AND Marcus Servius McDowell and Mrs. Jessie Cant, duly elected as School Trustees for Two (2) years,

AND George Dymond Hoyland duly elected as Police Commissioner for Two (2) years.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1919, I caused certified copies of Bylaws entitled:

“The City of North Vancouver Schools Extraordinary Loan Bylaw, 1920, No. 1”

“The City of North Vancouver Schools Extraordinary Loan Bylaw, 1920, No. 2”

“The Wallace Shipyards Limited Exemption Bylaw, 1920”

“The E.C. Walsh Lumber Company Limited Exemption Bylaw”

to be published and posted as required by law, together with notices appended thereto, that the said Bylaws would be submitted for a vote of the assent of the ratepayers at number 113 First Street East, on Thursday, January 15th, 1920 between the hours of 9 o'clock A.M. and 7 o'clock P.M., and that the said vote of the Electors was taken on the said day resulting as follows:

The vote polled in favor of the above mentioned Bylaw being at least three-fifths of the persons who voted on said Bylaws, I declared the said

“The City of North Vancouver Schools Extraordinary Loan Bylaw, 1920, No. 2”
“The Wallace Shipyards Limited Exemption Bylaw, 1920” and
“The E.C. Walsh Lumber Company Limited Exemption Bylaw”

as having duly received the assent of the Electors.

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1919, I caused a Notice to be published and posted to the effect that the opinion of the Electors of said City, would be taken upon the question:

“Are you in favor of the City Council, donating to the Great War Veterans’ Association a lot situate in the City, to be used by said Association for the purpose of erecting and maintaining thereon, a Memorial Hall, to be used for recreation and Club purposes”

The vote resulted as follows:

The vote polled in favor of the above mentioned Referendum being at least three-fifths of the persons who voted on said Referendum, I declared the said Referendum as having duly received the assent of the Electors.
