

CERTIFICATE OF RETURNING OFFICER

Result of Municipal Election held on the 13th day of January A.D. 1921

I, RUPERT FOSTER ARCHIBALD, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver do hereby certify that as directed by Statute I gave notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver on the 30th day of December 1920, as required by law, to the effect that Nominations for the Election of persons to represent the said Electors, in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen and the election of three (3) persons to represent them as School Trustees, for two years, and the election of one (1) person to represent them as Police Commissioner for two years, would be received by me at any time between the date of the notice and 2 o'clock p.m., Monday, January 10th, 1921, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, more Candidates stood nominated than there were vacancies to be filled in the case of Mayor, Aldermen, School Trustees and Police Commissioner: a poll became necessary and such poll was granted by me and opened at Larson's Pavilion, Esplanade West, on Thursday, January 13th, 1921, between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 7 o'clock p.m., and that after the closing of the poll the votes were counted resulting as follows:

As directed by the Municipal Council of the City of North Vancouver for the year 1920, I caused certified copies of Bylaws entitled, "The Wallace Shipbuilding and Drydock Company Limited Exemption Bylaw, 1921", the "E.C. Walsh Lumber Company Limited Exemption Bylaw", and "North Vancouver Water Agreement Bylaw, 1920" to be published and posted as required by law together with notices appended thereto, that the said Bylaws would be submitted for a vote of the assent of the Electors at Larson's Pavilion, Esplande West, on Thursday, January 13th, 1921 between the hours of 9 o'clock A.M. and 7 o'clock P.M., and that the said vote of the Electors was taken on the said day resulting as follows:
