

**MINUTES OF ADJOURNED MEETING OF COUNCIL HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, THURSDAY, JULY 14<sup>th</sup>, 1921, AT 7:45 P.M.**

The Clerk reported having interviewed Mr. Baird, Municipal Inspector, with respect to schedule of proposed Ferry Amendment Bylaw. That Mr. Baird, who is on his way to the Eastern Provinces, promised to write the Attorney-General's Department, with respect to the proposed amendment of the Ferry schedule

That as soon as the Bylaw is registered, certified copy is to be forwarded to Mr. Baird's office, as usual, and the members of his staff will forward to the Attorney-General for the approval of the Government.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "North Vancouver Ferry Amendment Bylaw, 1921" be now read a third time.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Moved by Alderman Townsley seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that leave be now granted to introduce at this meeting of the Council, a Bylaw entitled "North Vancouver Ferry Passes Regulation Bylaw, 1921" and that the said Bylaw receive three readings at this meeting of the Council, and that the occasion for such three readings be deemed an urgent one within the meaning of the Procedure Bylaw.

Whereupon the Bylaw was introduced and read a first time.

Moved by Alderman Townsley seconded by Alderman Morden and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "North Vancouver Ferry Passes Regulation Bylaw, 1921", be now read a second time.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read a second time.

Moved by Alderman Morden seconded by Alderman Irwin and resolved that the Committee proceedings with respect to the Bylaw entitled "North Vancouver Ferry Passes Regulation Bylaw, 1921", be dispensed with.

Moved by Alderman Morden seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "North Vancouver Ferry Passes Regulation Bylaw, 1921", be now read a third time.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read a third time and passed by the Council.

Alderman Cochrane drew attention of the Council to the fact that Mr. James Wilson, a resident of this City, who is a member of the "All Canadian Football Team", has won distinguished honours in the East, and Alderman Cochrane was of the opinion that a reception or some mark of distinction should be tendered Mr. Wilson on his return.

Moved by Alderman Morden, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that His Worship Mayor Vance and Alderman Irwin be empowered to act as representatives of this Council to arrange for a reception or mark of distinction to Mr. Wilson on his return.

moved by Alderman Morden, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the sum of \$25.00 be placed at the disposal of the Relief Department in aid of Mr. and Mrs. John Candlin, and that the Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized to issue a cheque accordingly.

At 8:35 p.m. it was moved by Alderman Irwin seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the Council do now adjourn. Whereupon the Council adjourned.
