Moved by Alderman Watson, seconded by Alderman McColl and resolved that the sympathy of this Council be conveyed to Ex-Alderman Frank Wheeler, in his serious illness, and hope for a speedy recovery.

Superintendent Campbell reported that the Shore gang is willing to have 5% deducted from their wages during the winter months, to be applied towards relief;

Also recommending that the remuneration for the Sweeper at the Ferry be set at \$4.00 per day.

Moved by Alderman Watson, seconded by Alderman McColl and resolved that the above report and recommendation of the Superintendent, be received and adopted, the remuneration for the Sweeper to be set at \$4.00 per day, and that 5% of the wages of the members of the Shore gang be deducted, to be applied to relief, effective as from September 1st, for six months ending February 28th, 1923.

At 4:40 p.m. it was moved by Alderman Watson, seconded by Alderman Prior and resolved that the Council do now adjourn.
