Tenders were received for supplying 10,000 window envelopes for Tax notices as follows:

Moved by Alderman Vance, seconded by Alderman Harron that the lowest tender from North Vancouver, viz, that of Shoemaker, McLean & Veitch Limited, be accepted.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Bridgman that the lowest tender be accepted.

A vote was taken.
