

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, MONDAY, JUNE 21ST, 1926 AT 8:00 P.M.

The Minutes of Regular meeting of Council, held June 7th, 1926, copies of which had previously been supplied each member of Council, were taken as read and on motion of Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright, adopted.

The Minutes of Adjourned meeting of Council, held June 14th, 1926, copies of which had previously been supplied each member of Council, were taken as read and on motion of Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright, adopted.

Correspondence was received, read and dealt with as follows:

From the Registrar, County Court, being receipts for registration of Agreement for Sale Form Bylaw No. 697, Electrical Inspection Bylaw, 738, Billboards Regulation Bylaw 739, Land Sales Bylaw No. 45, 740, First St. (North-Lonsdale to Lane W. of A-156-274) Concrete Sidewalk Initiative, 741` and First Street (North-Rogers to A-156-274) Sidewalk Initiative Bylaw 742.

Filed.

From the Building Inspector, recommending that two 2 roomed cabins belonging to the City on Lot 27/139/271 which are in a bad state of repair and filthy condition be demolished and the plumbing used to repair the plumbing in cabins on Lot 28, Block 139; also that the small 2 room shack without chimney or sanitary arrangements on Lot 30/139 be demolished.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the above report and recommendation be received and adopted and the work authorized.

From the Town Planning Commission, advising that the Commission approves the proposal of restricting laundries and the general question of zoning is now under consideration and a report will be submitted as early as possible.

From the Town Planning Commission, requesting to be supplied with a set of large scale maps for the use of the Commission.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the necessary maps be furnished the Town Planning Commission.

From the Town Planning Commission, applying for a grant of \$50.00 to defray cost of stationery and other incidentals.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to issue cheque in the amount of \$50.00 to defray expenses re Town Planning Commission.

From the Town Planning Commission advising that the City Commission will use its best efforts to ensure cooperation with other town Planning Commissions.

From the Town Planning Commission, recommending that the application of W.A. Dewey for a permit to construct a second dwelling on Lot 28/124/271 be granted, but that as much distance as possible be allowed between the two buildings.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above recommendation of the Town Planning Commission be adopted and building permit issued.

From the Town Planning Commission, advising that they are making other arrangements about place of meeting, but requesting permission to use the Council Room on Tuesday, June 22nd.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the above request be granted.

From the Mayor of the City of Windsor, Ontario, inviting the Fire Chief to attend the Fire Chiefs Convention in Windsor, August 24th to 27th.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the tanks of the Council be conveyed to the Mayor of Windsor for his kind invitation, but that the City cannot see its way clear to send the Fire Chief to this year's Convention.

From the Health Bureau, Vancouver Board of Trade, re Preventorium for the care of children, requesting that the City appoint a trustee.

Referred to Committee of the Whole.

From the Mayor of the City of London, inviting representatives to attend the Union of Canadian Municipalities Convention in London, Ontario, August 3rd, 4th and 5th.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the regrets of the Council be forwarded.

From the Town Planning Commission, recommending that a sufficient portion of the northerly part of Block 216 be definitely reserved to provide a future widening of 25th Street East.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the Town Planning Commission be advised that Block 216 has been reserved from sale in the meantime and that the matter is a good subject for discussion at first conference between the Commission and the Council.

From the City Clerk, Vancouver, advising that Alderman Dean will convene a meeting of the interested Municipalities re First Narrows Bridge, after June 22nd.

From the Board of Trade, requesting permission for a deputation to wait on the Council re supply of gas for domestic purposes.

Laid on the table.

From W.E. Walkden and H.S. Ashton, stating that their principals are now prepared to construct a suitable bridge over the First Narrows without calling upon any of the Municipalities to guarantee sinking fund and interest, and stating that they hope to submit a complete plan for approval of authorities within 90 days, from the 1st of June.

Filed.

From J. McKeith, 214 Esplanade East, requesting the Council to consider an exchange of Lot 18/144/274 owned by him for Lot 58/167/274 owned by the City.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the above request be referred to Finance Committee.

From C.H. Cates & Sons Lt., stating that they are considering constructing a wharf on their waterfront property adjoining Chesterfield Avenue approximate cost \$1,000.00 to be used for general purposes, as well as for mooring floating equipment, requesting to be permitted to use Chesterfield Avenue entrance, now used by the Great Northern Railway.

Captain Cates being present, by permission addressed the Council stating that his Company requires an entrance to their waterlot and would prefer an entrance from the foot of Chesterfield Avenue.

Referred to Committee of the Whole.

From A.K. Reid, applying for a building permit to erect a four room modern bungalow on Lots 1 and 2/31/272 Brooksbank Street.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above application be referred to the Water Committee and Engineer for report.

From R. Kerr-Houlgate and Summerfield Ltd., requesting permission to maintain a signboard on their own property, 15th and the Boulevard.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above request be not granted.

From Hireen & McConnell, requesting permission to maintain sign board on their own property on Lots fronting on the Boulevard.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that permission be not granted.

From D.G. Tate, C.M.C. North Vancouver, enclosing agreement between the City and District re exchange of water rights on Lynn Creek and Kennedy Lake.

Referred to Committee of the Whole.

From Geo. Chalmers, Ferry Superintendent, dated June 19th being report on specifications for uniforms for Captains, Mates, Engieners and deckhands.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that tenders be invited for supplying uniforms, etc., as per specifications submitted by the Ferry Superintendent.

Alderman Tolmie voting against.

From the Fire Chief, being report of Fires, with risks, insurance and losses for the month of May. Total loss \$1,420.00.

Filed.

From A.W. Lang, Osborne Road, inquiring if the City would lease a piece of property on the south shore lying between store and C.N. Oil tanks, not at present being used, offering to improve same and occupy on a monthly basis of \$35.00 per month.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the above matter be referred to the Chairman of the Ferry Committee and Superintendent for report.

From the Federated Seafarers Union of Canada, advising that this organization is preparing a wage scale to submit to the shipping Companies of B.C. and instead of including the North Vancouver Ferries, they suggest that seamen and firemen be given uniforms, and enclosing a suggested list of garments to be supplied to be renewed annually.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above communication be filed.

From the City Treasurer, reporting that the amounts of principal paid by mortgagers to the first of June is \$13,522.08, amount already forwarded Government \$11,600.00, leaving on hand \$1,922.08 and requesting authorization to forward cheque for principal \$1,900.00, interest \$1,582.16, total \$3,482.16.

Referred to Finance Committee.

Petition was received from H.A. Ackley and four others to have the alley between 20th and 21st Streets opened up as far west as the ravine – 100 Block west.

Referred to the Board of Works and Engineer for report.

From Wm. Halls and four others, applying to have the roadway opened in the 300 Block 28th Street West, also for a sidewalk.

Referred to the Board of Works and Engineer for report.

From Mrs. Alex McKinnon, applying to have to 400 Block 28th Street West opened up, also applying for sidewalk.

Referred to the Board of Works and Engineer for report.

Communication was received from Wm. Morden, on behalf of himself and other owners, stating that they are willing to accept their proportionate cost of the extra amount, viz, 50% of total \$550.00 for constructing the cement sidewalk at the property line instead of at the centre of the Boulevard.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the request of the applicants be not granted and that a copy of the above

resolution be forwarded to Mr. Wm. Morden on behalf of himself and other owners on the west side of Lonsdale between 3rd and 8th Streets.

The Clerk submitted Certificates dated June 21st, with respect to concrete sidewalks under Local Improvement, as follows:

Two petitions were received against the construction of a concrete sidewalk 6 feet wide on the west side of Lonsdale from 21st to City Limits.

Owing to petitions against not being sufficient to prevent the work being proceeded with as a local improvement, it was moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above report and Certificate be received and adopted and Construction Bylaw introduced.

One petition was received against the construction of a concrete sidewalk 6 feet wide on the north side of Third Street from Chesterfield Avenue to St. George's Avenue.

Owing to such petition not being sufficient to prevent the work being proceeded with, it was moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the above report and Certificate be received and adopted and Construction Bylaw introduced.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to issue cheque payable to W.C. Eisenman, balance due payroll of June 2nd and supplementary payroll dated June 16th, amount of cheque net \$82.50.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to issue cheque payable to Williston & Kennedy \$380.00 uniform account.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the following report of the Parks Committee be adopted:

The Engineer reported that he had visited the Cemetery recently in company with Alderman Cartwright and recommends

- (1) That two portions of the roadway which are not required for roadway purposes, be subdivided into burial lots.
- (2) That a portion of the new Cemetery be ploughed and levelled at an estimated cost of \$100.00.

The Committee recommended that the above recommendation of the Engineer be adopted.

The Engineer reported that owing to an accident on one of the swings at Mahon Park, it was through advisable to remove two of the swings at Mahon Park.

The Engineer recommended that additional swing accommodation be provided, also that a small dressing room for the children be provided in connection with the wading pool.

RECOMMEND that the above recommendation re dressing room be laid over in the meantime.

RECOMMEND that the swings be replaced.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the following report of the Board of Works be adopted:

The Engineer reported that it will be feasible to extend 25th Street from Ridgeway to Sutherland Avenue a distance of 2300 feet, to clear and rough grade would cost approximately \$1400.00.

RECOMMEND that the clearing and grading of 25th Street from Ridgeway to Sutherland Avenue at approximate cost of 41400 be authorized out of Bylaw money when the press of the Season's work is over.

RECOMMEND that when the press of the Season's work is over that Larson Road be improved northerly from 22nd Street to the boundary, worst places to be improved with gravel.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that the following report of the Finance Committee be adopted:

Alderman Tolmie submitted a Collectors Roll sheet, such as is now being adopted by Burnaby, good for ten years.

RECOMMEND that the above Collector's Roll sheet be referred to the Treasurer for report.

Re communication from J.S. Rogers, with respect to payments on Better Housing property.

RECOMMEND that Mr. Rogers be advised as to dates payments are credited on tax account, also on account of loan.

Re Better Housing accounts.

RECOMMEND that all parties having loans be advised of the necessity for complying with the resident requirements of the Provincial Government in order that they may obtain the benefit of the rebate of \$300.00.

RECOMMEND that in all cases where payments are in arrears, that the parties be notified that the city requires each current payment and 50% of a month's payment until arrears are paid up and that the Treasurer submit report on accounts in arrears frequently.

From Vernon & Buckerfield Ltd., with respect to Trades License.

RECOMMEND that Messrs. Vernon and Buckerfield Ltd., be advised that a new Trades License Bylaw is in course of preparation.

The Relief Officer reported that Mr. Duncan McDonald has no clothes and not much likelihood of his getting employment.

RECOMMEND that the Relief Officer taken such steps as may be necessary at his discretion to secure necessary clothing for Mr. McDonald.

The Collector reported with respect to arrears on Tax Sale properties 80 sales, 110 lots, \$28,804.82 selling price, \$11,142.58 paid, \$14,644.68 owing and past due and \$3,017.56 owing but not due.

RECOMMEND that Alderman Bridgman be granted leave of absence during his illness with payment of indemnity.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that he Mayor and Alderman Townsley be a Committee to act along with similar Committee from the Joint Councils with respect to domestic gas, and that the Board of Trade be thanked for their interest in starting negotiations.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Townsley and resolved that this Council express its regret at the passing away of Mr. J. Balfour Ker an old time resident of the North Shore and that an expression of regret and sympathy be conveyed to the family of the late Mr. Ker.

Moved by Alderman Townsley, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that this Council do now proceed to resolve itself into Committee of the Whole.
Alderman Loutet was appointed Chairman.
