

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, MONDAY, JUNE 18TH, 1928 AT 8:00 P.M.

The Minutes of Regular meeting of Council held June 5th, 1928, copies of which had previously been supplied to each member of Council were, on motion of Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman White, adopted.

Correspondence was received, read and dealt with as follows:

From the Registrar of the County Court, Vancouver, being receipt for registration of Bylaws numbered 955, 956 and 958.
Filed.

From the Inspector of B.C. Municipalities, being certificates of approval covering Bylaws 910 to 930 inclusive.
Filed.

From the Comptroller General, enclosing bill for \$225.53, being the cost of maintenance in the Provincial Home of J.L. Wickers, from April 1st, 1927, to March 31st, 1928.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Bridgman and resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to issue a cheque in favour of the Provincial Minister of Finance for the amount due.

From the Health Department, City of Vancouver, being their printed report for the month ending February 1928.
Filed.

From the Secretary of the Board of School Trustees advising Council that the Board of School Trustees have decided that the Extraordinary Estimates submitted by them at the last meeting of Council, shall be laid over indefinitely.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the Council agree with the wishes of the School Board in the matter.

From the City Clerk, asking Council to pass a resolution superannuating Constable Weir.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the recommendation of the City Clerk be adopted, and that Constable Weir be permitted to retire on a Superannuation basis.

From A. Aitken Gray, making application for the removal of a large stump on the Boulevard in front of his property at 2820 Chesterfield Avenue, as he was now putting the Boulevard in condition.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the application be referred to the Board of Works Committee with power to act.

From the City Solicitor advising that Council has power to pass a Bylaw compelling the clearing of brush etc. from vacant lots.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that the communication be laid on the table.

From Miss C. Homewood, 228 – 14th Street West, applying to have brush and fallen timber removed from Lot 13, Block 8A, D.L. 616, as same constituted a fire danger to a residence owned by her on the adjacent lot.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that the communication be referred to the Board of Works Committee and City Engineer for report.

From City Solicitor, advising that the Magistrate had made an order on Mr. Soday, Jr. to pay for the maintenance of his aged father, the sum of \$20.00 per month.

Filed.

From the Burrard Dry Dock Company Ltd. with list of 148 residents of the City of North Vancouver, reported as employed by them during the month of May.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the list of employees be checked by the Clerk, and if found to be in accordance with the terms of the agreement, filed.

From the Secretary of the Town Planning Commission, highly commending Council for the well considered improvements at the Vancouver Ferry Terminal, and urging the construction of a fully covered passenger-way and other improvements that body deems necessary on the North Shore.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that the communication be referred to the Ferry Committee for consideration and report.

From the Secretary of the Town Planning Commission referring Council to Section 10, Subsection 3, of the Zoning Bylaw as an answer to an enquiry regarding the most suitable location for the establishment of laundries and wood yards.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the communication be received and filed.

From Irwin and Billings Co. Ltd., as agents for the owner, applying for the completion of a sidewalk to the building at 2527 Lonsdale Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the matter be referred to the Board of Works Committee and Engineer for consideration and report.

From A. Rout Harvey, Secretary of the St. John's Church Committee, requesting the use of a City owned Lot adjacent to the Church (Lot A, Block 72, D.L. 548) free of taxes, for the Young People's Club of that Church, provided they clear and grade same.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the communication be referred to the Parks Committee for consideration and report.

From H.F. Caruth, 725 – 15th Street East, applying for lane to be opened at the rear of his property (Lot 19, Re-sub 2, Block 12, D.L. 616).

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Bridgman and resolved that the application be referred to the Board of Works Committee and the City Engineer for consideration and report.

From the Kwannon Club, Vancouver, organized for the purpose of providing comforts for tubercular patients at hospitals, asking the privilege of selling tags on the Ferries on Saturday June 23rd that being their Tag Day in the City of Vancouver.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the required permission be granted, subject to the restriction that the workers are not permitted to sell tags in the Men's Smoking rooms on the Ferries.

From the Secretary of the North Shore Real Estate Association, and from the City Assessor re sign of the North Shore Realty Co., recently placed on Lot 24, Block 24, D.L. 273, being the north-east corner of 3rd Street and Queensbury Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the North Shore Realty Co., and the North Shore Real Estate Association, through their Secretary, be requested to have all signs removed from City Tax Sale property.

From Mr. and Mrs. P. Allen and family, acknowledging with sincere thanks, flowers sent expressing sympathy on the death of "Pat" Allen.

From the Municipal Clerk of the District of North Vancouver advising that Council's application had been granted to connect a four-inch cast iron main with the Mosquito Creek Water System.

Moved by Alderman White, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the communication be received, and acknowledged with thanks.

From the Secretary of the Union of B.C. Municipalities, advising that the Annual Convention will be held in the City of Trail on September 12 and 13th, 1928. The Goods Roads League to meet in the same City on September 11th, 1928.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the usual number of delegates (3) attend.

His Worship the Mayor, Alderman Bridgman and the City Clerk were nominated as the delegation.

From the City Solicitor advising that the sittings of the Railway Commissioners in Vancouver fixed for June 29th, 1928, have now been cancelled altogether and that no sitting of the Board was expected before the fall of the Year.

The communication was ordered filed.

From H.W. Lang, owner of Lots 23 and 24, Block 14, D.L. 273, (being the northeast corner of 5th Street and Queensbury Avenue) stating he planned to erect three houses provided Council would permit the resubdivision of the property into three lots facing on to Queensbury Avenue.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that Mr. Lang be advised that his request cannot be granted as it is contrary to Bylaw.

From the B.C. Olympic Lacrosse Fund, New Westminster, applying to Council for a grant to send the B.C. Champion Lacrosse Team to represent Canada at the Olympic Games at Amsterdam.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the communication be referred to Committee of the Whole for consideration.

From the North Vancouver Board of Trade, advising that the Annual Dinner, of the Board will be held on Thursday June 21st at 7 p.m. at the Canyon View Hotel, price \$1.00 per plate.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the invitation be accepted and as many members attend as possible.

From H.S. Chambers, 1551 St. Andrews Avenue, drawing attention of Council to very bad condition of that roadway between 15th and 16th Streets.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the communication be referred to the Board of Works Committee with power to act.

From the City Fire Chief, submitting report for the month of May showing Nine Fire Alarms, with no fire loss.

Received and filed.

From the Lonsdale Motors Ltd. requesting that the City bear half the cost of a proposed permanent concrete crossing on Lonsdale Avenue to a gas station at the north-east corner of 15th Street and Lonsdale Avenue.

Moved by Alderman White, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the communication be referred to the Board of Works Committee and City Engineer for consideration and report.

Enquiry was made regarding the probably date of the opening of the Low Level Road.

His Worship the Mayor reported that during the afternoon he had been driven over the road, and noticed that boulders were being removed from the embankment, and that the

boulders so removed were being used at the foot of the slope to prevent danger to the roadway from further slides.

His Worship also stated that assurance had been given to him that the work would be completed by the end of this month.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Clerk write to the Board of Harbour Commissioners asking that the work be hastened as much as possible as it is the intention of Council to make the official opening of the Road one of the features of the Annual Dominion Day Celebrations, and that a special meeting of the council be called to accept the completed right-of-way.

Cornish, 326 – 26th Street East, North Vancouver, for the purchase of Lot 22, Block 231, D.L. 546, at the list price of \$175.00 be approved, and that the necessary Bylaw be prepared and submitted.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that the application of E. Harrison and Co., on behalf of Meymell H. Pigou, 240 – 21st Street East, North Vancouver, for the purchase of Lot 16, Block 230, D.L. 546, at list price of \$265.00 be approved, and that the necessary Bylaw be prepared and submitted.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the following report of the Finance Committee be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the following securities be purchased for the Sinking Fund Account from the Royal Financial Corporation Ltd. for delivery September 1st, at a fixed yield basis of 4.90:

£600 City of North Vancouver 4 1/2 % due September 1st, 1931.

£1100 City of North Vancouver 4 1/2% due March 1st, 1932.

£400 City of North Vancouver 4 1/2% due September 1st, 1961.

The Clerk reported that R.P. Clark and Co., had taken delivery of \$20,000.00 Hospital 5% Bonds, and that they were to take another \$5,000.00 Hospital Bonds in a day or two, that completing the amount authorized by Council to be sold at this time.

RECOMMEND that the Salvation Army be paid the grant of \$50.00 authorized for 1928 and that they be advised for future reference, that the City does not usually make payment of yearly grants until after the tax collection period, or during the month of September.

From the Secretary of the North Vancouver Hospital Board, requesting a credit of \$2500.00 from bylaw funds for a special building account and the sum of \$1000.00 from General Funds for the general account of the Hospital.

RECOMMEND that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the above sums, totalling \$3500.00, to the Board of Management of the North Vancouver General Hospital.

RECOMMEND that the British Columbia Bond Corporation be advised that the issue of 1911 City of North Vancouver Bonds cannot be registered as to principal, and that the Council at this time do not feel disposed to open a Debenture Registry Book.

The City Treasurer reported that the case of Mrs. L.S. Mowatt, owner of Lots 10, 11, and 12, Block 40, D.L. 548, stating that her 1928 Tax Notice showed arrears on Lots 10 and 11, for 1927. The tax receipt for 1927 disclosed that the taxes on Lot 12, being within a few cents of the total tax on Lots, 10 and 11, led her to assume that the amount paid \$71.22 represented the full total of taxes on the three lots.

Mrs. Mowatt now made application to the Committee to remit the penalty and interest on Lots 10 and 11.

RECOMMEND that Mrs. Mowatt be communicated with stating that her request cannot be acceded to.

From the City Relief Officer, showing relief paid during May - \$409.50.
RECOMMEND that the report be received and the payments confirmed.

RECOMMEND that the offer of £800.0.0 City of North Vancouver 4 ½% Bonds due 1961 from A.E. Ames and Co., at a yield of 4.70 be not accepted.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the following report of the Board of Works Committee be adopted:

Alderman Cartwright thanked the Acting Chairman of the Board of Works Alderman Anderson, also thanked the members of Council for the attention they had given to the duties of his office while he was absent in the British Isles, he stated his full appreciation of the excellent work done by the Acting Chairman, and that he accept his very sincere thanks.

RECOMMEND that the application of the First Church of Christ, Scientist be granted, to have some gravel place don the south side of Keith Road, opposite the Church, in order to allow for the parking of cars.

RECOMMEND that the application of Robert Bolam and others for the construction of a wooden sidewalk to join up the present walk with the one on Ridgeway Avenue be laid over in the meantime, and that at a future date the construction of a concrete sidewalk be considered.

RECOMMEND that the application of Betty Munroe of 213 – 22nd Street East for a sidewalk to be constructed in front of her property, be met by the construction

of a three-plank crossing across 22nd Street to connect with the concrete sidewalk to be built on the North side.

RECOMMEND that the City Engineer bring in at the earliest possible date a report showing the estimated cost of grading and surfacing the east side of Lonsdale Avenue from 19th Street to 23rd Street, with an allowance for a wide turning at 23rd Street and a separate report showing the estimated cost of grading and surfacing the same roadway from the north side of 23rd Street to the City Boundary. The surfacing to be of a composition similar to that already laid down on the west side and the cost to be figured against the property on the east side. The cost of the work to be as nearly as possible apportioned on the same basis as was done to the fronting property on the west side, when the roadway was surfaced on that side of the street.

RECOMMEND that the Committee be empowered to act in placing Danger Signs and other traffic warning markers on the Third Street hill, from Moodyville Bridge, to the foot of Queensbury hill, Distinct Markers to be placed at the top and bottom of the hill, and a marker of suitable colour to be placed in a conspicuous position, parallel with the roadway and reading "Keep Your Side of the Road".

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Bridgman and resolved that the following report of the Ferry Committee be adopted:

Correspondence was received from the Ferry Superintendent and dealt with as follows:

RECOMMEND that the action of the Superintendent be confirmed in hiring Mrs. MacKenzie as Cleaner of the Women's Cabins in place of Mrs. Neyedli, and that a cheque in full for the month of June, be paid to Mrs. Neyedli.

RECOMMEND that the selling of Tags be prohibited in the Men's Smoking Rooms on the Ferries, and that all organizations that are granted a Tagging privilege be so advised.

RECOMMEND that the adoption of the Superintendent's Specifications for needed repairs to the main deck of Number Three Ferry, the work to be done at the Annual Overhaul of the boat. Tenders to be called for in the immediate future so that the successful tenderer can have ample time to secure and air-dry all the lumber that will require to be used on the boat.

Letters were read from the Capitan's of the Ferries relative to the Mates and Deckhands not being in evidence when the boat is in transit.

The Communications seemed to indicate that the purpose of the Committee had been served by attention being drawn to the matter, and the letters were ordered filed.

RECOMMEND that the report of the Superintendent be adopted in the matter of tests on the last eight scow loads of coal. A slight fall under the guarantee was disclosed by the analysis and it was decided to collect from the Lonsdale Coal and Supply Co. \$30.38, a credit equivalent to 6.2 tons.

RECOMMEND that "Pay Toilets" be not established on the Ferries, or at the Vancouver Terminal, but that the Superintendent devise some wall surfacing in the lavatories that would effectively prevent writing thereon, and that authority be given to arrange for a more continuous water flushing of the urinals at the Vancouver Terminal.

RECOMMEND that W. Reynolds, relieving Mate on the Ferries (during the vacation season) be granted a Mate's Uniform, the suit to last for a period of two years in view of the fact that the Uniform is only in use part of the time.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the following report of the Waterworks Committee be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the application of C.H. Black and others for an improved water service on 26th Street between St. Andrew's Avenue and Ridgeway Avenue be authorized by the construction of a four-inch cast-iron main to connect with the main on Tempe Crescent, and the installation of a Hydrant be provided for at the corner of St. Andrew's Avenue and 26th Street this being required for fire protection. The estimated cost of the work - \$1000.00, to be paid for by "Water Works Loan Bylaw 1927" funds.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that the following report of the Fire and Light Committee be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the report on Street Lights for the month of May be received and filed and that the City Engineer and Fire Chief be asked to investigate the reason why so many Standard Light Lamps are found "no burning" each month. A better average in burning hours being desired by the Committee.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the following report of the Parks Committee be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the letter from A. Huggett, 1533 Queensbury Avenue, addressed to Alderman Wilson, complaining of the unsightly conditions on the Grand Boulevard, and on the front of property adjacent to his own, be answered by drawing the attention of the resident owners on the west side of the Grand Boulevard in the Fifteen Hundred Block in a fair and impartial manner to any exceptions that can reasonably be taken to any conditions that are seen to be contrary to City Bylaw.

RECOMMEND that the grass on the Grand Boulevard from 15th Street North, be cut, as dandelions and other weeds are very much in evidence, and that at a proper time the Clerk arrange an Article for publication in the Press, covering Noxious Weeds and control measures for Lecanium Scale, now so prevalent in the City.

Special Committees

Alderman Bridgman, on behalf of the Special Committee submitted a certified report from the City Auditors – Crehan, Mouat & Co., dated June 18th covering the Sinking Fund Securities of the City, showing in complete detail a tabulated summary of all the Securities held by the City, at a cost value of \$1,171,385.09.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the report of the Special Committee be received and filed, and that the Committee be thanked for their work.

Alderman Bridgman reported that some slight changes had been made in the contract arranged with J. Hardy for the decorating of the Council Chamber, a washable oilcloth being put on the walls instead of Burlap, and a new moulding more in keeping with the interior design being substituted. Alderman Bridgman and the City Engineer were of opinion that the changes would give a much more finished appearance to the Chamber.

Motions

His Worship the Mayor expressed the pleasure of Council at seeing Alderman Cartwright back from his visit to England, and looking so well, to which Alderman Cartwright suitable replied, giving a brief outline of his trip, which he had thoroughly enjoyed.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman White and resolved that on account of a former Minute not being clear to the Executive of the Ratepayers Association that the Clerk write to the Secretary of the Ratepayers Association advising that the recent trip of His Worship the Mayor to Ottawa re Airport matters, was undertaken at the joint expense of the following municipalities;

- City of North Vancouver
- District of North Vancouver
- District of West Vancouver
- Municipality of South Vancouver
- Municipality of Point Grey
- Municipality of Richmond
- Municipality of Burnaby,

And that the total expenses of the Mayor's trip amounted to \$525.00, the cost to the Municipality's being \$75.00 each.

With reference to the Local Improvement the Clerk reported that the Municipal Inspector has recently pointed out that where a reduction had been made in the Special Assessment imposed upon any lot having its flankage on a street, that the reduction so

made instead of being charged entirely to the Corporation should be charged back to the whole property benefited by the work after cost per foot front had been determined. As this interpretation of the Act would change materially the cost to the property owners on North and South Streets, it was decided to notify the owners affected by the following improvements of the increased cost of the proposed work:

West side of Chesterfield Avenue from esplanade to Fourth Street.

West side of St. George's Avenue from Esplanade to Fourth Street.

If it is found after they have been notified that no protests are received against the work at the additional cost, when the improvements shall be proceed with as originally outlined, that the City Solicitor be instructed to draw up a required amendment to the Local Improvement Act for submission to the Union of B.C. Municipalities, so that the proportion chargeable to property owners on the North and South Streets where long frontages prevail as in the City of North Vancouver that they be on a fair and equitable basis, with the charges to the property owners on the street running east and west where the short frontage or end of the lot is situated.

BYLAWS

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Bridgman and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "Esplanade – North (Rogers to Forbes) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928" be now reconsidered.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Tolmie, seconded by Alderman Bridgman and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "Esplanade – North (Rogers to Forbes) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928" as read and reconsidered be finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. No. 962.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "Chesterfield Avenue – West (Esplanade to Fourth) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928" be now reconsidered.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "Chesterfield Avenue – West (Esplanade to Fourth) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928" as read and reconsidered be finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. No. 963.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "St. George's Avenue – West (Esplanade to Fourth) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928" be now reconsidered.

Whereupon the Bylaw was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Bridgman, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled "St. George's Avenue – West (Esplanade to Fourth) Concrete Sidewalk

Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928” as read and reconsidered be finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. No. 964.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled “Second Street – South (St. Andrew’s to Lot 7, Block 153, D.L. 274) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928” be now reconsidered. Whereupon the Bylaw was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Tolmie and resolved that the Bylaw entitled “Second Street – South (St. Andrew’s to Lot 7, Block 153, D.L. 274) Concrete Sidewalk Local Improvement Construction Bylaw 1928” as read and reconsidered be finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal. No. 965.
