

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL ON MONDAY, AUGUST 3rd 1931 AT 8:00 P.M.

The Minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held on Monday, July 20th 1931, copies of which had previously been furnished to each member of the Council, were taken as read and on motion of Alderman Anderson seconded by Alderman Cartwright adopted.

Correspondence was Received Read and Dealt with as follows:

From the Registrar of the County Court, Vancouver, being receipt for Bylaws Numbered:

1305 "City of North Vancouver Land Sales Bylaw 1931, No.10"

1306 "Barber Shops Early Closing Bylaw 1921, Repeal Bylaw"

From the Inspector of B.C. Municipalities, Certificate of Approval in connection with Bylaw numbered:

1294 "The City of North Vancouver Local Improvement Debenture Consolidation Bylaw No.1, 1931".

Received and Filed.

From the Deputy Provincial Secretary, Certified copy of Order-in-Council numbered 913 covering Bylaw

1294 "The City of North Vancouver Local Improvement Debenture Consolidation Bylaw No.1, 1931".

Received and Filed.

From the Prime Minister of Canada acknowledging the Council's resolution suggesting measures to relieve unemployment.

Received and Filed.

From the Greater Vancouver Water District, inviting the Mayor and Council to visit the Waterworks Intakes on Seymour Creek on the afternoon of Wednesday, August 5th.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the invitation be accepted with thanks and as many members of the Council attend as possible.

From the Engineer dealing with complaints from residents of poor water pressure at the corner of 9th Street and Sutherland Avenue, which can only be remedied by extending the four inch water main a distance of two hundred and fifty feet at an estimated cost of \$300.00.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the matter be referred to the Waterworks Committee with power to act.

From the Engineer reporting that there is not available in the City on a scale which would permit of relief work being organized for that purpose, any suitable fir wood for cutting into cordwood.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the communication be filed for reference.

From the Engineer advising that the sidewalk on the East side of St. David's Avenue between 4th Street and Keith Road is beyond repair and in a dangerous condition and further recommending that it be removed and replaced with a three plank sidewalk at an estimated cost of \$220.00.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the recommendation of the Engineer be and is hereby adopted.

From the Engineer reporting on the petition of S. Zavaglia and others, applying for the construction of a Sanitary Sewer on Chesterfield Avenue between 14th and 15th Streets, and further recommending that the construction of a Sewer be proceeded with as a work of Local Improvement on the Initiative Plan at an estimated cost of \$1,350.00.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted and that there be prepared and submitted to the Council a Local Improvement report together with such other reports, estimates, and statements, as may be necessary to the proper passage of bylaws and the undertaking of the work.

From the Engineer reporting on the petition of J.A. Warren and others, for the construction of a Sanitary Sewer on 18th Street from Lonsdale Avenue Easterly to a

point two hundred and fourth feet East of St. George's Avenue at an estimated cost of \$5,000.00.

Moved by Alderman Huggett, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted and that there be prepared and submitted to Council a Local Improvement report together with such other reports, estimates, and statements, as may be necessary to the proper passage of bylaws and the undertaking of the work.

From the Engineer advising that he had examined the structure erected on top of the fence at the rear of 441 Keith Road East and finds that it is built across the rear of the lot and is in the nature of a fence about five feet in height above the original fence, which is also five feet high, the added fence does not appear to be for any particular purpose except to act as a screen to shut off view and would appear to be what is commonly known as a "Spite fence". The Engineer recommends that the City's Interim Zoning Bylaw be amended to provide jurisdiction over structures of this kind if it is not already provided for.

Moved by Alderman Wilson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the communication with a copy of the Interim Zoning Bylaw be referred to the Solicitor for report.

From Frederick Cunliffe, 1103 Lonsdale Avenue, drawing attention to the danger of surface water damaging the house and property at 419 13th Street East, also be bad smells arising from septic water coming from other properties. The complainant is of opinion that the water should be diverted down Moody and Ridgeway Avenues, otherwise he expects the City will assume responsibility for possible damages.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the Engineer report as to requirements for taking care of surface water, the Sanitary Inspector as to septic tank drainage and the Solicitor as to responsibility for damage.

From A. Nickson, complaining of the Dust nuisance on St. Andrew's Avenue between 4th and 6th Streets.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the application be referred to the Board of Works Committee with power to act.

From E.G. Excell, Secretary, North Vancouver Horticultural Society, advising that owing to unforeseen circumstances the Annual Exhibition will not be held this year.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the communication be referred to Committee of the Whole.

From E. Crute, 112 Victoria Park West, applying for two Mountain Ash trees, and sufficient grass seed to plant a boulevard fifty by twenty feet.

Moved by Alderman Wilson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the trees asked for be granted, and the applicant advised that the appropriation set aside for grass seed has been fully expended.

From the District of North Vancouver requesting that improvements be made to the roadway at Keith and Marine near the Barbecue.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the application be referred to the Board of Works Committee for report.

From Walter Jeanes, 230 East 24th Street, drawing attention to the unfinished condition in which the roadway was left by the City workmen at St. George's Avenue and 24th Street, also the urgent need for a street light at the same intersection.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the application as to the roadway be referred to the Board of Works Committee, and the Street light to the Fire and Light Committee for report.

From Wm. Bailey, 621 Pender Street West, requesting modification of the water rates recently imposed at the premises known as "Garden Court" owing to circumstances connected with the layout of the building not covered by the "Waterworks Regulation Bylaw".

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the communication be laid on the table pending a report from the Collector on suggested changes to the schedule of charges at present operative under the "Waterworks Regulation Bylaw".

From Mrs. P. Livingstone, 121 17th Street East, drawing attention to her metered water bill for the month of June being some \$20.00 in excess of the average monthly charge due to an undiscovered leak in an underground pipe laid on her property and requesting consideration therefore.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the Engineer bring in a report on the subject.

From Thomas Irwin, 115 West 2nd Street, with reference to the accrual of surpluses on Local Improvement assessments levied on property in which he is interested, stating that he had mailed to the Collector two cheques for the current year's taxes, one in amount \$45.00 under protest.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the communication be referred to the Finance Committee and Solicitor for study and report.

From H.D. Robinson, Secretary of the North Vancouver Unemployed Worker's Association, submitting the following resolution passed by that body:

"RESOLVED to petition the City Council that Unemployed workers be not penalized for delinquent taxes on their homes and that this point be added to the demands made by this Organization in our letter of July 12th 1931".

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the communication be filed along with former requests to be considered at the same time as other matters concerning unemployment.

From Tom Hanson, 1517 Lonsdale Avenue, applying for a foreman's job in the Works Department and W.H. Chapple 344 21st Street East, applying for a job as teamster.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the applications be filed for reference.

From Louisa E. Snowden, 336 22nd Street West, requesting the retrial age on Superannuation for females to be increased so that she could have a few more years of service.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the communication be referred to Committee of the Whole.

From A.C. Gladwin, 249 East 8th Street, requesting that he be permitted on taking his superannuation refund to make a new arrangement with the Corporation for subsequent service.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the application be referred to Committee of the Whole.

From R.F. Hale, tendering his resignation as Chief Clerk in the Engineer's office effective July 31st together with his appreciation for the consideration shown him during his five years of service, also from the Engineer stating that Mr. Hale's services had been satisfactory in every way and extending wishes for success in his new work.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Anderson and resolved that the resignation be accepted with regret and the Engineer's recommendation be endorse as expressive of the wishes of Council.

From the Comptroller submitting a report dealing with readjustments of the staff.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the communication be referred to Committee of the Whole.

The Clerk reported that a cheque had been received from the Provincial Government for \$10,850.88 being the City's share of Motor License fees for the period ended March 31, 1931.

From the Canadian Transport Co. Ltd. requesting the privilege of paying for ferry tickets in larger amounts by cheque.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the company be advised that marked cheques can only be accepted.

From the Building Inspector reporting that the premises at 436 Park Street (owner C.L. Hoskins) and at 4th Street and St. George's Avenue (owner L. Reda Estate) had not according to notice remedied the sanitary conditions complained of and the premises were still being used for human habitation.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the consideration be referred to Committee of the Whole.

From George Reid, 426 6th Street East, applying for a position as Ticket-collector or Deckhand on the City Ferries.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the application be filed for reference.

From the Solicitor submitting a proposed amendment to Section 326 of the Municipal Act.

“Section 326 of the “Municipal Act” is repealed and the following substituted therefore:

326 “Any Municipality granting aid or assistance in any way to any person or persons may take security by mortgage or otherwise for the repayment of the same, or may accept an absolute conveyance of any real property or interest therein as payment in satisfaction or on account of any aid or assistance so granted, and may pass all necessary bylaws to carry the provisions of this section into full force and effect, and any security or conveyance taken may be registered in the name of the Municipality in the Land Registry Office”.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the proposed amendment be endorsed and a copy forwarded to the Secretary of the U.B.C.M. for presentation at the forthcoming convention of B.C. Municipalities.

From the Solicitor draft resolution re Joint Police Force for serving adjacent Municipalities:

WHEREAS it is felt that in Municipalities to which the provisions of the Municipal Act apply and which are contiguous or adjacent to each other, not only would considerable saving of expenses be effected but greater efficiency would result, were the policing of these Municipalities carried out by one body of police officers directed by a Chief of Police and under the control and management of a joint Board of Police Commissioners appointed from the several Municipalities who are parties to the arrangement:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that an application be made to the Legislature of the Province of British Columbia for the granting of power to neighbouring Municipalities (exercisable by Bylaw with or without the assent of a majority of the electors, as the Legislature may deem expedient) to enter into an agreement with each other for the establishment, regulation, management, maintenance and control of a Joint Police Force in and for the combined area, and directed by a Chief of Police and for sharing the cost of such Police Force, for such period of years, and on such terms, as the respective Councils may determine, and for providing in the event of such agreement being entered into for the formation at the Municipal Elections to be held next succeeding the date of the final passage of the Bylaw confirming the said agreement, of

a joint Board of Police Commissioners in and for the Municipalities affected by the agreement, as a continuing body during the subsistence thereof, and composed of the Mayor or Reeve and two members from each Municipality, elected and holding office in like manner, and for the like period, as if each Municipality constituted a separate District in accordance with the provisions of existing legislation, such Joint Board to be presided over by one of its own members appointed by it as Chairman from year to year, and for making amendments to the Municipal Act as may be necessary for the carrying of this purpose into effect.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the principle be adopted and a copy forwarded to the Secretary of the U.B.C.M. for submission at the forthcoming annual Convention.

From Wm. Fisher, Barrister, Calgary, re property held in the City of North Vancouver by the late Rev. John McCartney Wilson, Berwickshire, Scotland, together with a Notarial certificate of the confirmation of the Executrix for probate purposes.

Moved by Alderman Huggett, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the correspondence be referred to the Solicitor.

From H.F. Gillis, 348 13th Street East, applying for a position as Ticket-Collector on the Ferries.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the application be filed for reference.

From the Solicitor advising that C.H. Cates and Son Ltd. are liable under the terms of the lease for a monthly rental of \$50.00 from May 1, 1923 to February 23rd, 1924 for the Westerly fifty feet of premises purchased by the City from the North Vancouver Land and Improvement Co. Ltd. instead of the sum of \$15.00 per month paid on account thereof.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that C.H. Cates and Son Ltd. be billed for the difference and notified that in future all accounts must be paid at the Collector's office at the City Hall.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the following report of the FINANCE COMMITTEE be adopted:

Arising out of a communication on behalf of Mr. James Schenini, 154 First Street West, who had paid taxes on the same property for twenty-seven years, it was recommended that a Special Committee be appointed to consider the advisability of securing an amendment to the Municipal Act whereby some reasonable power could be exercised by a Municipal Council in cases where taxpayers find themselves liable to lose their homes for unpaid taxes.

Committee appointed: Mayor Bridgman, Alderman Anderson, Alderman Loutet, and the Solicitor.

RECOMMEND that an early meeting of the Council will be held on a suitable date to consider the Assessed values placed on Land and Improvements within the city.

RECOMMEND that the July report of Relief distributed totaling \$636.12 be adopted.

RECOMMEND that the necessary book entries be made debiting Relief for water rates amounting to \$9.50 due by Mrs. M. J. Parkin, 892 17th Street East, and crediting Water Collections account. (Mrs. Parkin is an elderly widow without means of living alone, and the Medical Health Officer advises her supply of water should not be discontinued.)

RECOMMEND that in view of the family circumstances the fee of \$18.00 for digging the graves of Martha Jacobson (Mother), and Velma Ada Jacobson (daughter), be and is hereby remitted and that the necessary book entries be made to that effect.

RECOMMEND that in making the change over the telephone equipment, direct calls be established to each office.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the following report of the FERRY COMMITTEE be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the correspondence in regard to injuries said to have been sustained by the infant son of Charles Edward Miron through coming in contact with an exposed steam pipe on Ferry No. 2 on July 31st. last, be referred to the Solicitor with power to act.

RECOMMEND that the additional rate of one percent required to reduce the franchise liability on the ferries from \$500.00 to \$250.00 be further studied in connection with the average of losses for the past five year period.

RECOMMEND that the "Owl Ferry Service" be arranged in the best possible manner, taking into consideration the convenience of the public and a reasonable return for the services provided.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the following report of the BOARD OF WORKS COMMITTEE be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the application of T. Mills for an improved crossing in front of his garage on Esplanade East be granted.

RECOMMEND that the owing to the water washing away the boulevard opposite 613 Keith Road West, that the box drain in the gutter be extended some sixty feet opposite the above address.

RECOMMEND that the ruts in Keith Road be repaired between Mahon Avenue and Bewicke Avenue and afterwards treated with an application of Road Oil at an estimated cost of \$125.00.

RECOMMEND that following an accident to Mr. W. Allies 224 20th St. East, in attempting to climb on a City Truck, drivers are warned that they must not pick up passengers while on the City's business.

RECOMMEND that the Finance and Board of Works Committees carefully check the unexpected Committee balances and report to Council on what steps are necessary in the way of restricting the number of days to be worked each week by outside employees.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Loutet and resolved that the following report of the HEALTH COMMITTEE be adopted:

RECOMMEND that the present system of collection garbage be retained for the following reasons:

- (1) The present system has given satisfaction and the cost merely varies with the amount of work done.
- (2) It is often necessary to make extra calls and to extend the service, which under contract would necessitate an increase in the cost.
- (3) As shown recently it will be necessary to change the dumps from time to time and such changes under a contract would probably be expensive for the City.
- (4) Under the present system any complaints in regard to the dump can be remedied without having to deal with a third party and it is possible to deal with all complaints in regard to the service which would not be so easy under the contract system.

REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

INDIAN RESERVE

RECOMMEND that the triangular piece of roadway likely to be required from the Squamish Indian Reserve No. 1 (Mission) for the Third Street Cut-off and the water supply on the Reserve itself, be the subject of a joint survey and report by the City Engineer in co-operation with Mr. Ball, Indian Agent.

TAXICABS AT FERRY TERMINAL

RECOMMEND that the Ferry Superintendent investigate and report on the condition and the use of the buildings on the west side of the Vancouver Ferry Terminal, the triangle between the Subway and the roadway and any other space controlled by the City that could be utilized for better accommodation of taxicabs.

MOTIONS AND NEW BUSINESS

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Cartwright and resolved that the Burrard Inlet Tunnel and Bridge Co. be requested to furnish a statement of all obligations, agreements and disbursements completed or in a course of completion, written or implied, since the Bridge went out and the copies of same be sent to each member of the Council.

BY-LAWS

From the Chief of Police certifying that petitions had been signed by more than three fourths in number of the occupiers of Barber and Hairdressing shops in the City of North Vancouver entitled to vote at Municipal elections therein.

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the petition be received and approved and the prayer of the petitioners granted by introducing to Council a by-law for the "Early closing of Barber shops and Hairdressing shops in the City of North Vancouver."

Whereupon it was moved by Alderman Wilson, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that leave be now granted to introduce at this meeting of Council a By-law entitled "THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER BARBER AND HAIRDRESSING SHOPS EARLY CLOSING BY-LAW 1931" and that said by-law receive three readings at this meeting of Council and that the occasion for such three readings be deemed an urgent one within the meaning of the Procedure By-law.

Whereupon the By-law was introduced and read a first time.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the By-law entitled "THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER BARBER AND HAIRDRESSING SHOPS EARLY CLOSING BY-LAW 1931" be now read a second time.

Whereupon the By-law was read a second time.

Moved by Alderman Cartwright, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the Committee Proceedings in respect to the By-law entitled "THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER BARBER AND HAIRDRESSING SHOPS EARLY CLOSING BY-LAW 1931" be dispensed with.

Moved by Alderman Huggett, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the By-law entitled "THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER BARBER AND HAIRDRESSING SHOPS EARLY CLOSING BY-LAW 1931" be now read a third time.

Whereupon the By-law was read a third time and passed by the Council subject to reconsideration.

Moved by Alderman Brown, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the By-law entitled "THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER LAND SALES BY-LAW 1931, NUMBER 11" be now reconsidered.

Whereupon the By-law was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Wilson, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that the said By-law as read and reconsidered, be now finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal No. 1307.

Moved by Alderman Brown, seconded by Alderman Wilson and resolved that the said By-law entitled "A BY-LAW FOR RETIRING FROM SERVICE CERTAIN CITY EMPLOYEES UPON ATTAINING CERTAIN AGES" be now reconsidered.

Whereupon the By-law was read and reconsidered.

Moved by Alderman Wilson, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the said By-law as read and reconsidered, be now finally adopted, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk, and sealed with the Corporate Seal No. 1310.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Huggett that:

WHEREAS a resolution was passed at a meeting of the Joint Council of the City and District of North Vancouver, and the District of West Vancouver.

WHEREBY it was agreed to recommend to the respective Councils the preparation and submission to the ratepayers of money by-laws for the purpose of taking additional stock in the venture known as the Burrard Inlet Tunnel and Bridge Co. in the following amounts:

Moved by Alderman Anderson, seconded by Alderman Huggett and resolved that the Clerk endeavour to arrange a Conference – for the purpose of discussing the Harbour situation as it more particularly affects the North Shore of Burrard Inlet – between the Council and Sir Alexander Gibb on the occasion of his forthcoming visit to Vancouver to study Harbour developments at the Port of Vancouver.

Moved by Alderman Loutet, seconded by Alderman Brown and resolved that this Council do now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole.

Alderman Anderson was appointed Chairman.
