

CERTIFICATE OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Municipal Election held on the 14th day of January A.D. 1932

I, George Simmers Shepherd, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver, do hereby certify that as directed by Statute, I gave notice to the Electors of the City of North Vancouver as required by law, on the 31st day of December 1931 to the effect that Nominations for the purpose of electing a person to represent the said Electors as Mayor, for the election of Three (3) persons to represent them as Aldermen, for the Election of Four (4) persons to represent them as School Trustees, and for the election of One (1) person to represent them as Commissioner of Police, would be received by me at any time between the date of the Notice and two o'clock p.m. on Monday, the 11th day of January 1932, and that at the expiration of the time appointed for the nomination of Candidates as aforesaid, only three persons, namely Thomas Smith Brown, Marcus Servius McDowell, and Fergus MacLachlan were nominated for the office of School Trustees; and only one person, namely, Donald MacLean was nominated for the office of Commissioner of Police, I forthwith declared the said THOMAS SMITH BROWN, MARCUS SERVIUS MCDOWELL, and FERGUS MACLACHLAN elected as School Trustees and DONALD MACLEAN elected as Commissioner of Police, for the City of North Vancouver, for the ensuing term of two years, and returned their names to the Clerk of the Municipality.

More nominations were received by me than there were vacancies to be filled in the case of Mayor and Aldermen and a Poll became necessary, and such Poll was granted by me and opened at 115 First Street East, and at the Horticultural Hall, 22nd Street and Lonsdale Avenue, City of North Vancouver, on Thursday, the 14th day of January 1932, between the hours of 8 o'clock a.m. and 8 o'clock p.m. and that after the closing of the Poll the votes were counted with the following results:

CERTIFICATE OF THE RETURNING OFFICER

Result of the Municipal Election on Referendum, held on the
14th day of January 1932

I, GEORGE SIMMERS SHEPHERD, Returning Officer for the City of North Vancouver, do hereby certify that as directed by the Council of the said City of North Vancouver, on the 4th day of January 1932 I caused to be published a notice "That at the time and place for holding the Municipal Elections for the City of North Vancouver for the year 1932, the opinion of the Municipal Electors of the said City shall be obtained by ballot on the following questions:

"Are you in favour of the City entering into an agreement with the Attorney General on behalf of the Province, whereby all Police duties of the City shall be done by Provincial Officers."

The said vote of the electors of the City of North Vancouver was taken on the 14th day of January 1932 and resulted as follows:
