- 1<sup>st</sup> Dominion Day (Saturday)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> & Engaged in the general business of administration. Attended a joint meeting of the Vancouver Parks Board and the Vancouver City Council on Monday (3<sup>rd</sup>) and on Tuesday (4<sup>th</sup>) at North Vancouver and a conference with Mr. C.N. Tubman, both meetings held to discuss the general question of Unemployment Relief.
- Cancelled the membership of both the City & District of North Vancouver in the B.C. School Trustees Association. Authorized necessary repairs and renewals to all of the typewriters in the Commercial Department of the High School. Discontinued the issuance of permits to North Shore students attending the Vancouver Technical School beginning with the school year September next.

Arranged that free transportation be granted on the City Ferries to all children from North Vancouver attending the "Elks' Annual Flag Day" at Hastings Park on Wednesday August 30<sup>th</sup> next.

Extended civic greetings to the Officers and men of H.M.S. Dragon at the Boulevard Park – occasion North Shore Cricket week.

In connection with the application of the City Solicitor for added remuneration on account of the amount of work involved – Offered a lump sum of \$250.00 as a gratuity for extra work, caused by the establishment of an Administrative Commission, with a promise to again review the situation at the end of the present year.

Did not consider favorably the suggestion from the Provincial Superintendent of Welfare that the Municipalities join in sending sick husbands away from their jurisdiction in the hope that a change might improve their physical condition.

7<sup>th</sup> Invited Mr. Wm. McMahon, 260 West 6<sup>th</sup> St., to become a member of the Town Planning Commission in place of the former Chairman of the Parks Committee who was an ex-officio member of the Board.

On account of reorganization and the possibility of closing one of the City Schools notified Mrs. Goodyear and the Misses Harding and Vance that their services would not be required as school teachers in The City of North Vancouver during the next school year.

- Joined party of representatives from the interested Municipalities on a tour on inspection of the Seymour development of the Greater Vancouver Water District of which the District of North Vancouver is a member.
- 13<sup>th</sup> Did not approve of the proposal to appoint a trained Woman Investigator for the North Shore under the Auspices of the Vancouver Welfare Federation.
