- 7<sup>th</sup> Arranged to mail to all interested Taxpayers a memorandum concerning the Annual Tax Sale setting forth the amount actually due on the property, together with the benefits of taking advantage of the rebate on penalties and interest prior to the date of the Tax Sale, September 1933.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Approved the application made under the terms of "The Motor Licensing Bylaw 920" to permit the Vancouver Deep Cove and Dollarton Stages to carry passengers for hire in The City of North Vancouver. (Second half of year).

9<sup>th</sup> On recommendation in writing of the School Doctor, the following child was permitted a school transfer on account of his physical condition: Kenny Richardson from Ridgeway to Queen Mary School.

Five cases of Scarlet Fever were reported by the Medical Health Officer, who at the time of the report stated that all precautionary measures had been taken.

- 11<sup>th</sup> Letter from Professor Barss of the University of B.C. recording his favourable impression of the display of products exhibited in the special class at the annual show of the North Vancouver Horticultural Society, raised from seeds supplied to the registered Unemployed.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Instructed the Chief of Police to take steps to notify Mr. C.D. Jermyn that he would be required to testify in the H.R. Straw Case at the sittings of the Assize Court.

Signed and sealed mutual release of claim in connection with Hospital affairs between the City & District of North Vancouver, the North Vancouver General Hospital and E.H. Valentine and Wife.

- 13<sup>th</sup> Received from the Minister of the Interior, through Mr. Munn, MP copy of the first Order-in-Council dealing with the acquisition of Stanley Park by The City of Vancouver thereby completing the City's files in this connection.
- 14<sup>th</sup> Approved the application of the Grouse Mountain Highway and Scenic Resort Ltd., for permit to use Auto 89243 at the Ferry Wharf, North Vancouver, to pick up and lay down passengers to and from the Chalet.
- 15<sup>th</sup> Approved lease for period of one year, under date September 15, 1933, to Ruddy, Duker Co., Ltd. for space on the Vancouver Ferry Wharf on which to erect advertising signs.

Approved the closing of the Public Schools on the afternoon of Friday, October 20<sup>th</sup> next for the purpose of allowing the teachers to attend the Annual Convention of the Local Federation.
