7th Authorized repairs costing approximately \$250.00 to the Mosquito Creek Bridge at Keith Road & Fell Ave., as a result, this work will give a much needed widening of the roadway at this point of some 2-1/2 ft.

On reading the certificate of E.A. Martin, M.D. retired from service as at May 8, 1934, Captain R.R. Spicer of the City Ferries on the grounds that he had become incapacitated by physical disability from properly performing his duties as a Master Mariner.

Approved the application for Superannuation of Ritchie Roy Spicer, Master Mariner on the City Ferries – Joint Life and Last Survivor Plan.

8th Reconsideration and final passage of a Bylaw entitled "The City of North Vancouver Fell Avenue Street End Lease Bylaw 1934."

Reconsideration and final passage of a Bylaw entitled "The City of North Vancouver McKay Avenue Street End Lease Bylaw 1934."

Signed, sealed and delivered two separate 16 year leases from the Crown to the Corporation of The City of North Vancouver covering the above street ends as described in the aforesaid Bylaws numbered 1390 and 1391. (These leases give the City better title to Fell & McKay Ave. Street Ends which hitherto have been leased direct to Fell & Lonsdale the City being in the position of a sub-lessee) The Harbour Board takes the position that a Quit Claim Deed cannot be obtained without their consent which was withheld.

- 9th Commenced work on Mosquito Creek Bridge this bridge is situated on the main East-West Road and the work is particularly urgent on account of the near opening of the Second Narrows Bridge.
- 11th Completed a survey of the various types of insurance carried by the City in order to afford better protection to the rate payers. Agreed to the consolidation of a number of existing policies through local agents.

12th On the recommendation of the Fire Chief and following consideration of four tenders submitted through the Fire Department, approved the placing of eight (8) pairs of Firemen's uniform pants between:

F. Franco 4 pairs at \$10.00 each A.J. Kennedy 4 pairs at \$10.00 each

13th Received and filed the monthly narrative and statistical report of the North Vancouver Health Unit in which it is stated "The general health of community is good and the School attendance is good in all schools."

Following a conference with Public Boards and officials, approved the following changes in the Ferry service effective midnight June 18, 1934 also that the Bylaw entitled "The Ferries Operation and Maintenance Bylaw 1926" be amended by striking out the following words and figures namely:-

Class "C"

(Passenger Autos) Passenger automobile, including driver, one way .25c (and buggies) Single buggy, including driver, one way .25c

Communication tickets for vehicles with driver in Class "C", 12 tickets for \$2.00

AND SUBSTITUTING THEREFORE the following words and figures:

Class "C"

(Passenger Autos) Passenger automobile, including driver, one way .25c one way return .40c (and buggies) Single buggy, including driver, one way .25c one way return .40c

Communication tickets for vehicles with driver in Class "C", 16 tickets for \$2.00

And by striking out the figures .25c load ticket in Classes "D" and "E" in the general schedule of rates and tolls and substituting therefore the figures .10c load ticket.

- 16th Endorsed Government cheque for \$78.00 to the personal order of Mr. J.B. Benett covering grant in aid of Special Home Economics Classes for the unemployed.
- 18th Second Narrows Bridge officially opened at 2 pm.
- 19th A group of able-bodied unemployed, representing the North Shore Association of Unemployed Associations, who have steadily refused to work out the amount of Relief granted, successfully picketed City jobs which are being done by men also on Relief, but who have shown a willingness to sustain themselves by working out on a voluntary basis the amount of their Relief.

The aforesaid group states that they are organized for work and wages at Trade Union rates and demand:

- (a) A wage rate of .50c per hour to be paid in cash on all civic projects.
- (b) \$15.00 per month in cash over and above the present maximum Relief Scale.
- 21st Conference with Mr. Goodlad of the Canadian Merchants Service Guild respecting renewal of the working agreement covering deck-officers on the City Ferries.
- 22nd Conference with Mr. Donaldson of the Federated Seafarer's Union respecting renewal of the working agreement covering seamen and firemen on the City Ferries.
 - Work on Mosquito Creek Bridge has now progressed to a point where the roadway can be opened to through traffic.
- 23rd Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council #788 approving Bylaw 1392 entitled "The Ferries Operation & Maintenance Bylaw 1926, Amendment Bylaw 1934."
- 25th Confirmed the following staff changes L.A. Farrell vice C.D. Jermyn at a salary of \$130.00 per month, and J.G. Jones vice L.A. Farrell at a salary of \$100.00 per month effective July 31, 1934.

Notified the North Vancouver General Hospital that in the event of the Hospital Gardener occupying the premises situated Lot A, Block 60, D.L. 549 at December 31st next, the property in question could then properly be entered in the 1935 Assessment Roll as assessable but exempt from taxation.

Notified Employers' Liability Assurance Corporation that possible injury may have been sustained by Mrs. E. Macdonald 437 Keith Road East, through falling on the stairs of #2 Ferry on June 15th last.

26th Discussed proposals in connection with the future handling of the Ambulance. Matter referred back for further investigation.

Application made to the Provincial Home for Incurables for the admission, as a City expense, of Wilberforce E. Birch, a married man residing at 272 East 4th St.

Endorsed Government cheque for \$118.50 to the personal order of Mr. J.B. Bennett, covering grant in aid of Special Technical training for the unemployed.

Accepted resignation of Leona A. Parkin, teacher on the City School Staff.

28th Completed reorganization of working conditions at Fire Hall.

Effective July 1, 1934:

Permanent Staff – Chief and seven men. Chief's Salary \$130.00 per month. Free house and phone.

Seven men - \$90.00 per month – free phone.

\$10.00 extra per month to be paid to the men designated to carry out inspections under "The Fire Marshall Act."

Volunteers - \$2.00 per hour, \$1.00 per hour for drills and false alarms. Permanent staff 24 hours on 24 hours off – 1 day off in seven.
