TO HIS HONOUR
THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

THAT by Order-in-Council No.841, approved on the 30th day of June 1934, made pursuant to Part XXIII of the "Municipal Act" John Villiers Fisher was appointed a Commissioner for The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver and for The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver; said Order to take effect on Saturday, the 30th day of June 1934, at twelve o'clock noon;

AND TO RECOMMEND:

THAT the salary of the said John Villiers Fisher as such Commissioner of The Corporation of the District of North Vancouver and The Corporation of the City of North Vancouver shall be paid at the rate of one hundred and sixty dollars per month for the months of July, August and September, 1934, and sixty dollars per month thereafter; and that he shall furthermore be paid for all expenses by him incurred in his capacity as such Commissioner.

THAT said payments shall be made out of the municipal revenue collected by him as such Commissioner and shall be apportioned as follows, namely; sixty per cent, from the revenue collected on behalf of the Corporation of the City of North Vancouver and forty percent from the revenue collected on behalf of the Corporation of the District of North Vancouver.
