24th Accepted offer of F.C. Bramble to purchase the Westerly 25 feet of Lot 5, Block 168, D.L. 274, City of North Vancouver at a price of \$500.00 on terms not to exceed beyond one year subject to the required procedure and the necessary bylaw being prepared and submitted.
