- 8th The Medical Health Officer reports the general health of the Community as good except for some mild Scarlet fever. The usual milk samples have been taken during the month.
- 9th Ferry Pass NO.67 issued to Mr. Frank Howard, Physical Instructor, at recreation classes now being conducted in the City under government auspices.
- 11th Approved repairs involving an expenditure of some \$300.00 at the West Vancouver landing of the Vancouver Ferry Terminal.
- 12th Sold secondhand disused 40 H.P. Electric Motor #9469 to Chambers Electric Co., Esplanade East for the sum of \$150.00. \$60.00 cash balance of \$90.00 November 20, 1935.
- 13th RESOLVED: That sales of land of \$100.00 or less shall be paid for by a minimum cash payment of 33-1/3% of the purchase price and completed within a period of six months.

- 21st Reconsideration and final passage of "The City of North Vancouver Gasoline Service Station Early Closing Bylaw 1935."
- 22nd Approved the application effective December 1, 1935 of William Fatke, Captain on the City Ferries, to become a contributor to the Superannuation Fund at the rate of 8% instead of 4%.
- 23rd Approved the placing of an order with the Canada Creosoting Co. Ltd. for a second creosoted timber pontoon for use at the ferry docks at an estimated cost of \$980.50.
- 25th Introduction and three readings of Bylaw 1415 entitled "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale Bylaw No.3, 1935."
- 26th Approved plan 4-N-9-54B of the Harbour Commissioners proposing elimination of backfill and bulkhead at plate shop of Burrard Drydock Co. on the Esplanade subject to the Commissioners keeping the City harmless against any claim for damages arising out of their constructional operations.
- 27th Reconsideration and final passage of Bylaw 1415 entitled "The City of North Vancouver Tax Land Sales Bylaw 1935 No.3."
- 28th Approved application on his own behalf from Delbert Becker to be superannuated on the Single Life Plan.
