12th Notified by the City of Vancouver that the land and improvements comprising the Vancouver Ferry Terminal have been exempted by bylaw from taxation for the year 1936.

13th Court of Revision on the Assessment Roll closed today 10.15 am.

The Medical Health Officer reported that during the month of January the general health of the community was good although colds, influenza and a few cases of communicable diseases were still present.

14th Preliminary trial of George Sydney Jenkin concerning an apparent shortage amounting to \$2,257.00 in the accounts of the Corporation under his care.

15th Awarded equally between the Home Oil Distributors Ltd. and the Shell Oil Co. of B.C. Ltd. a contract to supply approx. 90,000 gallons of diesel fuel oil to Ferry No.4 delivery to be taken at the North Vancouver Terminal at the price of .06c per Imperial gallon and .01c per gallon Provincial tax.

17th From 12 competitive bids Hewett's Market, North Vancouver, was awarded a contract to supply to the various departments, 85 cases of paper hand towels and 52 cases of toilet tissue as set out in specifications of February 10, 1936, at the gross price of \$542.70. Delivery in February and August.
