- 1st Letter was received from the Junior Board of Trade enclosing list of suggestions re municipal work. Filed.
- Accepted charge of 70 cents per day in connection with the admission of Sister Raphaella to St. Paul's Hospital.
- Received letter from Robert Patterson, 2340 Chesterfield Avenue, calling attention to a tree at the head of the trail at View Street, which is rocking dangerously.
- Ordered that the dangerous tree referred to be taken down at the earliest possible moment.
- 2nd Took delivery by mail from A. E. Ames & Company of \$500.00 City of North Vancouver 5½% bond, due August 1st 1954 at \$28.00 flat.
- Statement of Ferry receipts for the month of March was received and filed.
