Letter was received from the Vancouver Metropolitan Shopping Centre Association, Vancouver, inviting the Commissioner to attend a meeting.

The Ferry Superintendent, at the request of the Commissioner, attended the meeting and reported that the area referred to is Hastings Street between Main and Carrall Streets and that they intend lighting up this area and giving prizes to buyers in this area, and asking for \$40.00 per month from the City of North Vancouver to assist.

Authorized that owing to the financial condition of the City that no action be taken at the present time.

Authorized that Lists of properties for Sale be prepared, as requested, for the use of the North Shore Real Estate Association.

5th Took delivery by mail this morning from A. E. Ames & Company of \$1000.00 City of North Vancouver 5% bond, due April 15th 1945 at the price of \$28.50 flat.

The Voters' List for the year 1939 containing 2913 names was hung up on this date as required by the Municipal Elections Act. 19 names appear on the under \$100.00 list.

8th Received report from the Ferry Superintendent enclosing reports from Captain F. L. Coe, Deckhands J. Dunn and J. Muir and Stewardess Mrs. A. McKenzie, regarding a Miss Sarson of 622 Kings Road East having fallen when boarding Ferry No. 3 at 1.40 p.m. from Vancouver and hurting her knee. Copies of reports were forwarded to the Insurance Company.

- 23rd Received report from Capt. F. L. Coe and Engineer Mathieson that at 10.55 a.m. to-day, while clearing log which lay in the fairway at North Vancouver, No. 3 Ferry bumped into the west lead doing considerable damage to the upper structure. No damage to steering gear of vessel.  
 The Superintendent reported that damage to lead is estimated at \$150.00.
- 24th Authorized that the building at present situated on Lot 49 (save and except the westerly 5 feet) Block 166, D. L. 274 is dangerous to the public safety and it is hereby ordered that the said building shall be pulled down and removed by the owners within 60 days from this date and in case of default by the owners, agent, lessee or occupier to comply with the above order, the Building Inspector shall carry out the work and charge the cost to the said owners.  
 Above notices were forwarded to Isabella Brough Bramble, Northlands, Robert O'Hara 358 East 3rd Street and Arthur Doray, 360 East Esplanade.
- 25th Letters were received from the City of Vancouver re Fire boat protection for waterfront properties, suggesting that two boats be built at a cost of \$250,000.00 and if the waterfront owners put up the capital cost of the boats the City of Vancouver will maintain same at a cost of approximately \$75,000.00 per year.  
 Authorized that the City of Vancouver be advised that the Commissioner is in favor of the scheme, but that a fire hydrant was installed last year by the City of North Vancouver for the protection of the wharf and buildings at the Vancouver wharf.  
 Received report from Capt. J. Larsen that at 7.40 a.m. to-day, in dense fog the S. S. "New Delta" touched the guard near the apron of Ferry No. 4. The ferry was drifting at the time.  
 Later report was received from Captain of the "New Delta" that no damage was done to his boat.  
 No damage to Ferry. Filed.

28th Granted permission to the North Vancouver Junior Board of Trade to erect a Christmas Tree at the Ferry wharf.

J. Houlden was authorized to decorate the Ferry Wharf as per previous years.

29th Authorized the purchase for sinking fund purposes of \$100.00 City of North Vancouver 5% bond due October 7th 1961 at \$26.00 flat from Pemberton & Son Vancouver Limited.
