- 2nd Public Holiday - New Year's Day.
- 3rd Introduction and three readings given to "City of North Vancouver Prepayment of Taxes By-law 1939."
- 4th Report of Ferry Receipts for the month of December was received and filed.
- 5th "City of North Vancouver Prepayment of Taxes By-law 1939" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.
 Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
- Report of the Municipal Inspector of Schools and for the month of December, was received and filed.
- 6th The Annual Report of the Ferry Superintendent for the year 1938 was submitted to the Commissioner and referred to Estimates.
- 7th Authorized that application be made to the Finance Committee of the Vancouver City Council for exemption from taxation of the Vancouver Ferry Terminal property.
- 9th Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief Form R. A. 12-B (Revised) covering Relief disbursed for the month of December.
- 11th Police report for the month of December was received and filed.
- 12th Report of the North Vancouver Health Unit Committee for the month of December was received and filed.
- 13th Tenders for the supply of 3000 feet of 8" cast iron pipe for Waterworks purposes were opened by the Commissioner and referred to the Superintendent of Works for tabulation and report.
- Forwarded to the General Superintendent, Employment Service of Canada, accounts for relief disbursed by the City of North Vancouver for the month of December.
- Forwarded to the Director of Medical Services, Statement of Heads of Families and Single cases on Relief for the month of December.
- Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief, declaration of expenditure re supplying clothing and boots to eligible indigent persons for the month of December.
- Forwarded to Inspector Hood, Victoria, List of Vehicles owned by the City for which free licenses are requested for the year 1939.
- 14th Statement of Receipts for the month of December was received and filed.
- Authorized that Ferry Pass No. 50 in the name of Paul de Buzogany be and it is hereby cancelled.
- Authorized that Ferry Pass No. 64 be issued to Mr. Tommy Hood, Recreation Class Teacher, which pass will expire on April 15th.
- 16th Received report from J. Smith, Foreman, with reference to complaint of Joseph Ellis of Ellis Dairy that his light delivery truck had sunk up to the mud guards on Heywood Avenue near the old bridge over 3rd Street on the morning of January 1st.
 Authorized that this matter be referred to the B. A. Securities Corporation for attention.
- Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 21 approving "City of North Vancouver Prepayment of Taxes By-law 1939."
- 17th Authorized acceptance of the usual charges re Frank Chapman being admitted to the Out-patients Department of the Vancouver General Hospital.
- 18th
 19th Commissioner at Victoria on Municipal business.

- 20th Received from the City Clerk , Vancouver, certified copy of By-law No. 2552 which exempts from taxation the property comprising the Vancouver Ferry Terminal of the North Vancouver City Ferries.
Authorized that this By-law be filed and that the Vancouver City Council be thanked for this concession.
- Authorized the sale of Lot 26, Block 132, D. L. 274 with improvements thereon to Margaret Simpson Michel at the price of \$500.00.
- 21st "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1939, No. 1" was introduced and given three readings.
- 23rd Authorized the purchase for sinking fund purposes of \$1000.00 5% ferry bond due 1950 from Pemberton & Son Vancouver, at the price of \$28.00 flat.
- The Superintendent of Works submitted report on tenders for 3000 feet of 8" cast iron water pipe to be used on St. Andrew's Avenue.
Authorized that the tender of the local firm, viz., Paine Hardware Limited in the amount of \$1.45 $\frac{1}{2}$ per foot be and it is hereby accepted.
- Authorized that Messrs. Armstrong, Strutt & Gardiner Ltd., be advised that the City cannot accept liability for damage to Mr. Ellis' milk truck on Heywood Avenue on January 1st.
- Authorized that the North Vancouver Health Unit be requested to appoint one member to represent the City of North Vancouver and the City School Board on the Metropolitan Health Board in place of Commissioner Vance who now represents four bodies.
- Authorized that a suggestion be forwarded to the Department of Municipal Affairs that Clerk D. G. Tate be appointed Acting Commissioner for the period of the absence of the Commissioner at Ottawa, this being required on account of the Court of Revision to be held during the absence of the Commissioner.
- 24th "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law ,1939 No. 1" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.
Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
- 25th Notified Mrs. I. B. Bramble, Northlands, that the building on Lot 49, Block 166, D. L. 274 has not been removed yet and if same is not torn down within one week from this date, the City will remove the building.
- Authorized that Ferry Pass No. 65 be issued in the name of Mr. Paul de Buzogany, Recreation Class Teacher, same to expire April 15th 1939.
- Authorized that application be made to the Steamship Inspectors for an extension of time of three days for annual overhaul and inspection of No. 3 Ferry, as new H. P. Cylinder is expected from Scotland, to be installed at that time.
- 26th Authorized the purchase for sinking fund purposes of \$1000.00 City of North Vancouver 5% bond, due 1965 and \$300.00 City of North Vancouver 5% bonds due 1961 from Samis & Wilson at the price of \$26.00 flat for both.
- 27th Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 83 authorizing the appointment of D. G. Tate as Acting Commissioner for the City of North Vancouver during the temporary absence of Commissioner Vance from the City.
Authorized that copy be forwarded to the Royal Bank of Canada.
- Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 100 approving "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1939, No. 1."
- Authorized that the concession of the B. C. Electric Railway Company in allowing reduced rates for cooking appliances for Home Economics classes, as contained in their letter of January 25th, be accepted.

27th List of Complaints to the Court of Revision against Assessment, were posted as required by law.

Authorized that the necessary By-law be prepared for the sale of weekly passes for automobiles on the ferries at the rate of \$1.00 per week.

30th Introduction and three readings were given to "The Ferries Operation and Maintenance By-law 1926, Amendment By-law 1939."

Commissioner Vance absent from the City journeying to Ottawa at the request of the Minister of Municipal Affairs.
