Authorized the execution of Lease between the City and Colin M. Astbury of Lots 1 to 6 and 25 to 30, Block 164, D. L. 271 for a term of three years from January 1st 1939 at a yearly rental of \$700.00 payable monthly in advance; three months notice in writing to be given in case the premises are required by the City.

Miss Una Barton resigned from the Teaching staff of the City Schools effective June 30th and her resignation was accepted.

27th Delegation from the North Shore Unemployed Association met the Commissioner at 10 a.m.
