- 18th The Commissioner and Supt. of Works interviewed the Relief Administrator, Mr. Griffith, at Victoria and submitted to him details of proposed work under the Provincial-Municipal Agreement.
- 19th Commissioner at Victoria on official business.
- Forwarded to the Director of Medical Services statement of Heads of Families and Single cases on relief for the month of June.
- Forwarded to the Gen. Supt. Employment Service of Canada accounts for relief disbursed by the City for the month of June.
- Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief declaration of expenditure re supplying clothing and boots to eligible indigent persons for the month of June.
- 20th Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 970 dated July 18th 1939 approving "The City of North Vancouver Land Sales By-Law, 1939".
- 22nd Authorized the approval of Drawing No. K-8800/2423 showing proposed location of pole on Tempe Crescent, south of 27th Street.
- 24th Authorized that in future when organized picnics are held in Mahon Park on Sundays that a charge of \$4.00 be made to cover the caretaker's wages.
- Received a lengthy report from E. A. Cleveland, Commissioner, Greater Vancouver Water District, showing approximate cost of the said District taking over the City waterworks and having all water supplied by the Greater Vancouver Water District.
- Authorized that copies of this report be handed to the various officials for consideration.
- 25th Accepted invitation to take part in the Vancouver Exhibition Association Parade of Progress on August 28th with official car suitably decorated.
- The Ferry Superintendent reported verbally that the guard of No. 4 Ferry was damaged on Sunday, July 23rd, caused by the Excessive swell or wash set up by the "Princess Elaine" of the C.P.R. while operating in the Harbour contrary to Sec. 62 of the Harbour Regulation By-laws.
- Authorized that the matter be taken up by the Superintendent with the C.P.R. with a view to that Company paying for the necessary repairs.
- Received telegram from the Relief Administrator, Victoria, stating that the projects submitted on the 17th inst. had been approved by Ottawa and stating that it would be in order for the Municipality to proceed with the work: More detailed instructions to follow. Amount of the project \$30,000.00, work to be done on Parks, Cemetery and water mains.
- 26th Introduction and three readings given to "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1939, No. 7".
- Three gentlemen from the Vancouver Broom and Brush Manufacturers interviewed the Commissioner, with regard to having water installed to their proposed plant on the Low Level Road.
