- 1st Authorized the purchase for sinking fund purposes of £100. City of North Vancouver 5% bonds due 1963 at the price of \$27.00; also £100. City of North Vancouver 5% bonds due 1961 at the price of \$27.00, each with 1933 and subsequent coupons attached, from Odlum-Brown Company, Vancouver.
- 2 Report of Ferry receipts for the month of July was received and filed.
- 3 Received report from the Ferry Superintendent that No. 4 Ferry was disabled from 11.35 a.m. until 4 p.m. on July 31st, a rope having got tangled in the propeller. No damage was done to vessel. The Insurance company was notified.
- 3rd Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 1062, dated August 2nd 1939, approving "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1939, No. 7."
- 4th Took delivery by mail from Messrs. Odlum-Brown Company, of £200. City of North Vancouver 5% Debentures due July 1st 1963 at the price of \$262.80.
- 5th Received petition through W. J. Irwin from four owners in Block 8, D. L. 549, to have a certain portion of lane opened up. It was decided that this work cannot be undertaken at the present time.
- 7th Tenders for the printing of 10,500 Assessment Notices for the City and District were opened and considered and the tender of the K. Watson Printing Company at a price of \$24.65 including government tax was accepted.
- 8th Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief, Form R. A. 12-B (Revised) covering Direct Relief disbursed by the City for the month of July.
- 9 Letter of thanks was sent to J. B. Olson and his Band for the splendid concert they provided in Victoria Park on Sunday last.

- 14 "North Vancouver Street Traffic By-law 1923, Amendment By-law 1939 No. 3" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate seal.
- Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant. Governor in Council.
- 15th 15 Granted permission to the Elger Boys Band to hold a concert in Victoria Park on Sunday, September 3rd at 2.30 p.m.
- 16 Forwarded to the General Superintendent Employment Service of Canada, accounts for relief disbursed by the City for the month of July.

15th Forwarded to the Director of Medical Services statements of Heads of Families and Single cases on Relief for the month of July.

Forwarded to the Administrator of Unemployment Relief, declaration of expenditure re supplying clothing and boots to eligible indigent persons for the month of July.

Received certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 1120 dated August 16th 1939 approving "North Vancouver Street Traffic By-law 1923, Amendment By-law 1939 No. 3."

18th Authorized that the water service be extended from the Harbour Board Booming Ground Caretaker's house to the Pacific Coast Handle Co. Ltd., for their proposed factory, pipe connection to be made by the City without delay and meter to be installed. However the City does not accept responsibility for maintaining the present private line but will co-operate at all times in maintaining the best service possible.

19th Mr. Heaps interviewed the Commissioner this morning re use of roads in the City and District.

The Commissioner approved the use of the connecting highways in the City and District to Bewicke Avenue Street end for the carriage of articles from the proposed logging operations on Hollyburn Ridge to the Booming ground at the foot of Bewicke Avenue, Mr. Heaps agreeing that the loads on the highway would not be more than should be imposed by ordinary traffic.

Authorized that the National Harbours Board be advised to this effect.

23rd Authorized that Commissioner Vance be appointed delegate from the City to the U. B. C. M. Convention to be held at Harrison Hot Springs on September 19th and 20th.

28th The Commissioner officially attended the Opening of the Vancouver Exhibition.

29th Authorized that Militia tickets be issued to 2nd Lieutenant T. S. Baron of the B. C. Regiment for the use of soldiers who are doing guard duty at various points in North Vancouver, and travelling by ferry.

On the recommendation of the Welfare Dental Committee, the Commissioner approved and hereby confirms the appointment of Dr. T. G. Thompson as part time dentist with offices in Queen Mary School at a salary of \$1000.00 per school year, payable \$100.00 monthly.
