WHEREAS, according to the Assessment Roll for the City of North Vancouver, John William Hewett of North Vancouver, is the owner of Lots 8, 9 & 10, Block 141, D. L. 274.

And Whereas on September 22nd 1933 a charge by way of mortgage in the amount of \$7,000.00 was registered against the said lots, in the name of John Anderson Morrin of Vancouver.

And Whereas all the above lots have been assessed as one parcel. And Whereas the said John William Hewett and John Anderson Morrin have agreed with each other and with the City that the said land and improvements be assessed for the years 1938, 1939 and 1940 in two parcels, viz:-

Lots 9 & 10 to be assessed as one parcel in the sum of Land \$2,200.00 and improvements \$2,250.00.

Lot 8 to be assessed as one parcel in the sum of \$1,000.00 as to land and \$1,000.00 as to improvements.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that an agreement be entered—into between the said John Wm. Hewett and John Anderson Morrin and the City of North Vancouver, agreeing to the assessment being set as above for the years 1938, 1939 and 1940 and that the taxes payable in respect of the said three lots be based on the above assessments in two parcels.

And that the Commissioner and City Clerk execute the said agreement on behalf of the City.
