

JUNE 1941

- 2nd Received letter from the Official Board, St. Andrew's United Church, asking for supervision of the Kinsmen Playground, so that Sunday services will not be disturbed by noise.
 Authorized that the above Board be advised that the playground will be open on Sundays from 1 to 6 p.m. and locked during the remainder of the day.
- 2 Authorized that application be made to the Deputy Attorney-General for Messrs. T. H. Heape and Paul D. J. Marshall to be appointed Commissioners for taking affidavits; Commissions of H. A. Lintott and H. S. Chambers to be cancelled.
- 3 Authorized that K. A. Ray be advised that the Commissioner agrees to a lease for two years of Ferry Refreshment stands on the Vancouver Terminal at a rental of \$35.00 per month for the first year and the rental for the second year to be fixed later.
- 4 Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 738 dated 28th May 1941 approving the application of the City of North Vancouver to construct a highway crossing over the Right-of-way of the Pacific Great Eastern Railway.
- 3rd Statement of Receipts on the North Vancouver Ferries for the month of May was received and filed.
- 4th Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 745 dated June 2nd 1941 approving "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law 1941, No. 7."
- 7 Authorized the approval of the resubdivision of Lots 8, 9 and 10, Block 35, D. L. 550 in such manner that the northerly four feet of Lot 10 be added to and form part of Lot 9. Lot 10 will then be known and described as Lot 10 (save and except the Northerly 4 feet), Block 35, D. L. 550 .
- 4 "The City of North Vancouver - Pacific Great Eastern Railway Crossing By-law 1941" was introduced and given three readings.
- 5th Authorized that A. F. Tero be advised that Lots 2 & 3, West Part Block 50, D.L. 549 have been further reserved for him at 50% of the assessed value up to December 31st 1941, but that he be notified that the property cannot be reserved after that date.

- 10th Received Certified copy of Order-in-Council No. 781 dated June 6th 1941 approving "The City of North Vancouver Land Sales By-law 1941, No. 1".
- 11th Authorized the approval of Drawing No. K-8800/2809 of the B. C. Electric Railway Company showing proposed poles on 3rd Street, St. Patrick's Avenue and Esplanade.

- 11th Authorized that the necessary By-laws be passed whereby the present Right-of-way over the P. G. E. Railway in Block 177, District Lot 271 & 274 be cancelled and another crossing installed over Lot 18 in the same Block, this change being necessary on account of war work being carried out by the Pacific Salvage Co. Ltd.
- "The City of North Vancouver Tax Lands Sale By-law No. 8, 1941" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.
Certified copies were forwarded to Victoria for the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.
- "The City of North Vancouver Lands Sale By-law 1941, Number 2" was reconsidered and finally adopted by the Commissioner, signed by him and the City Clerk and sealed with the Corporate Seal.

- Authorized that Lots 16 & 17, Resub. 1, Block 20, D. L. 548 with improvements thereon be advertised for sale.
- Authorized that 10% of contract price be paid to the West Coast Salvage & Contracting Company Ltd., they having performed work according to contract re Ferry No. 5.
- Received report from Captain E. Porter that No. 4 Ferry when arriving at North Vancouver at 6 p.m. this day, propellor seemed not to grip water and the boat struck the circle hard. Some people were knocked down. Mrs. Mahn sent home in taxi and a Mrs. Williamson also injured.
 Authorized that copies of this report be sent to the Employers Liability Assurance Corporation and the British American Securities Limited for attention.
- 21st The Commissioner accepted on behalf of the citizens of the City and District of North Vancouver a Silver Cup presented by the Sales Force of the North Vancouver Unit of the 1941 Victory Loan Campaign in appreciation of the magnificent response made by the citizens towards the Victory Loan.

- Authorized that the Acting Harbour Master be written to drawing attention to the large amount of sawed off piles and driftwood floating in the harbour which makes the landings of the ferries difficult and dangerous.
